Solar electricity covers 35% of Four Seasons' facility needs, allowing energy to be sold back into the grid on sunny days.

1,425,460 lbs of Corrugated Cardboard recycled





This corrugated cardboard was recycled to be turned into other cardboard and paper products in 2024.

Over 3.5 million lbs of surplus fresh food donated in 2024



The Four Seasons Family of Companies contributed almost 3.5 million pounds of surplus fresh food to Blessings of Hope. Another 1.1 million pounds came from partners with products stored on-site. The donated food is sorted and then distributed to food pantries, nonprofits, or assembled into community food boxes to support families in need.



180,440 lbs of Shrink Wrap and Plastic sent to Trex



In 2024, the shrink wrap and plastic sent to Trex was turned into composite decking and composite outdoor furniture.

1,545,600 lbs of Surplus Produce No Longer for Consumption sent for Compost



In 2024, the surplus non-consumable produce was sent to a local composting operation to be used.

164,940 lbs of Waxed Cardboard sent to Enviro-Log in 2024



This waxed cardboard was sent to Enviro-Log and turned into fireplace logs in 2024.


