PROMO ORGANIC ASPARAGUS, BEANS, & BRUSSELS



GOOD NEWS! **Organic Asparagus** will be promotable right through Easter and for the rest of April. Quality is outstanding, and availability will be steady. After Easter, pricing may inch up a little bit when the Cabora, Mexico region finishes, yet we'll have support from Hippy Organics right through the month to keep product moving.

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Green Beans** from Mexico have experienced a boost in supply volume as the Easter holiday approaches. Quality has been outstanding and pricing is promotable.

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Brussels Sprouts** remain promotable with excellent supply and affordable pricing for early April.



OG BERRIES

NOTE: Weather, including March flooding in California and rain in Baja, Mexico, is hampering **Organic Berry** production overall, just as demand is about to pop for the spring.

ALERT! **Organic Strawberries** will be very limited after rain in Baja slowed all harvests down. Quality has been good but with the added demand from the Easter week, expect limits and pro-rates.

ALERT! **Organic Raspberry** volumes will be very short as rains in Baja has slowed down production. Central Mexico fruit is also slowing down quickly.

ALERT! **Organic Blueberry** prices will remain expensive for early April as domestic harvests have not yet begun. California fields have been short due to rain. Florida/Georgia crops are expected to start in mid-April. Imports have slowed down, causing the short markets. Mexico is harvesting very little as well. Expect short supplies and limits heading into the Easter weekend.

ALERT! **Organic Blackberry** prices remain high will limited availability out of Mexico. Gaps in harvests continue to leave supplies short.



OG CITRUS

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Mandarins** continue in good supply. We are now in the "Tango," "Murcott," and "Golden Nugget" varieties from California.

Organic Cara Cara and **Navel Oranges** are in the latter parts of the season in California. Promote while you can since supplies will go down and prices will go up as one vendor at a time finishes from now until May.

Organic Lemons should be in better supplies in the coming weeks as the weather clears.

NOTE: **Organic Pummelos, Minneola Tangelos, and Blood Oranges** will finish for the season during April.

Organic Grapefruit is a little lighter in supply due to the rain.

ALERT! **Organic Limes** from Mexico have become very expensive due to light volumes being harvested and exported, plus anticipated little to no picking the week before Easter (Holy Week).



OG LETTUCCES & SALADS

NOTE: East Coast **Organic Lettuce** production is limited in late March and early April as Lady Moon Farms progressively transitions out of Florida and into their Georgia fields. Product will be harvested in both areas during early April, however, will not be plentiful from either location.

ALERT! California **Organic Lettuce** production is also amid transition to the spring/summer growing region. California supplies are expected to struggle during April because of all the rain events and field flooding that have occurred in California recently.

ALERT! **Organic Romaine Hearts** and **Iceberg Lettuce** from California are approaching a difficult period as transition is underway and northern growing regions faced extreme rainfall. Expected limited supply availability and subpar quality throughout April.

ALERT! **Organic Salad** producers are canceling or discouraging activity during April since they have concerns over ability to fill orders in full from all the Salinas, California area flooding.



OG POTATOES

New crop **Organic Red** and **Gold Potatoes** are expected to come into season out of the California desert region and arrive to the East Coast after Easter. This product is expected to be gorgeous and command strong pricing.

ALERT! "Tasteful Selections" **Organic Mini Potatoes** will be in a seasonal gap through mid-June.



OG CELERY

Organic Celery from the desert growing regions in the Imperial Valley of California continue to harvest in late March, however the season will end quickly in early April. Expect prices to remain promotable in early April as harvest during the last week of March and first week of April will continue to produce strong volume.

As the transition north will begin, that supply volume will quickly tighten as production in the northern growing regions have been affected by rain.



OG TROPICALS

GOOD NEWS! Supplies will be promotable for the start of April on Fair Trade **Organic Royal Star Papayas** from Mexico. Quality has been excellent.

Organic Drink & Eat Coconuts, Organic Coconut Chunks, and Young Thai Coconuts will be available for the start of April.

NOTE: **Organic Red Dragon Fruit** will be out of stock briefly for the start of April but should return around the second week of the month due to small gaps in between container shipments from Ecuador.



OG WARM VEG

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Eggplant** and **Zucchini** supply from Lady Moon Farms in Punta Gorda, Florida are experiencing a flush of production with improved promotable pricing and top-notch quality.

Organic Cucumbers and **Yellow Squash** from Mexico continue to yield steady supply volumes for early April. **Organic Yellow Squash** has experienced limitations in supply during March however, as April approaches supply volume is expected to improve slightly.



OG TOMATOES

Lady Moon Farms **Organic Grape Tomatoes** will be promotable through Easter. Quality has been great and there is plenty of product to grab.

Organic Roma Tomato will be promotable into the middle of April. Quality is outstanding and availability will be steady.



OG BOK CHOY

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Bok Choy** product is beginning to flourish out of Georgia for Lady Moon Farms.

Expect steady supplies of **Organic Bok Choy** and **Baby Bok Choy** for April now that we're into a new East Coast growing region.

Organic Red Baby Bok Choy will also be available from Georgia to offer a nice pop of color.



OG SWEET ONIONS

Organic Vidalia Sweet Onions are expected to get started on 4/19.

Old crop Nevada grown **Organic Sweet Onions** are winding down for the season. We will plan to finish up in early April and have a smooth transition directly into the Vidalias.



OG WATERMELONS

Organic Mini Seedless Watermelon spring harvests should start coming into steady volume by mid-April. Weather has slowed harvests down but once they start, they will come on with good supply quickly.

Organic Seedless Watermelons are still about 3-4 weeks away from beginning harvests out of Mexico in late-April.



OG CUT VEG

As growers transition up to the Salinas, California area, supply issues are expected to impact fill rates on **Organic Broccoli & Cauliflower Florets** starting the week after Easter.

This is all a result of the rain, flooding, and cool weather in California during March.



OG HOTHOUSE CUCUMBERS

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Euro** and **Mini Seedless Cucumbers** will be promotable right into the middle of April. Quality is great and new crop Canadian product has started.



OG PEARS

GOOD NEWS! Import **Organic Abate**, **Red Bartlett**, and **Green Bartlett Pears** are starting to ramp up in excellent supply and promotional opportunities available. **Organic Anjou Pears** will get started soon.



OG MANGOS

Organic Ataulfo Honey Mangos will be in steady supply for the beginning of April. Look to promote!

NOTE: Mexican **Organic Round Mangos** have tightened considerably. The fruit is just not maturing enough to keep up with demand, so pricing will be up somewhat for April.



OG BROCCOLI & CAULIFLOWER

Organic Broccoli volume and prices remain steady as suppliers conclude their desert growing seasons in the Imperial Valley of California during late March. **NOTE:** Production will quickly begin to decrease in early April as suppliers shift growing operations north where weather events during the planting and growth stages will surely affect quality and availability. Difficult market conditions should be expected throughout the entire month of May due to the rain experienced in Northern growing regions.

Organic Cauliflower from California will face many of the same difficult challenges that **Organic Broccoli** is fighting during April. **NOTE:** After a quick glut of product at the end of March, pricing is back on the rise, but production is down as the desert growing region prepares to finish. Expectations should be tapered as production will remain limited throughout April and drive increases in costs.



OG AVOCADOS

Organic Hass Avocados from Mexico are in steady supply on 48ct fruit.

NOTE: However, 60ct fruit is more limited, and pricing on those 60ct **Organic Hass Avocados** has jumped up for the start of April.

Some fruit harvested right now may exhibit some darker black color, while remaining hard to firm. This fruit especially, should have the excellent oil content that make Mexico avocados so creamy and taste so good!

“Equal Exchange Fair Trade” **Organic Hass Avocados** are similar to the rest of the market: 48ct - good, 60ct - limited supplies, small fruit for packs - good



OG GREENS & KALES

GOOD NEWS! East Coast **Organic Greens** from Lady Moon Farms have made the transition from Florida to new crop Georgia in late March.

This transition has been smooth with almost no gaps in supply, and many items remain promotable for the wet rack.

Expect excellent supply, beautiful quality, and reasonable pricing on **Organic Green** and **Lacinato Kale** for Easter.

Organic Collards from Lady Moon are ramping up in Georgia, along with their famous **Organic Rainbow Chard** and **Red Kale**.

OTHER STORIES

• **NOTE:** **Organic Grapes** are in light volume with high prices, especially on **Organic Red Grapes**. Look for the Import season to end in late April.

• **ALERT!** **Organic Red Bunched Beets** volume continues to struggle with limited production in early April. Expect supplies to remain limited until at least mid-April due to quality issues with the tops.

• **NOTE:** **Organic Pink Lady Apples** are in a short packing supply gap but are expected to return over the next few days, expect sporadic supplies and strong markets for the rest of the season.

• **Plan out your ordering and delivery timelines with your rep.** See next page for the Four Seasons Easter schedule.

• **If you are not waiting on trucks and have the product on hand, your department operations will run as smoothly and efficiently as possible.** Your time will be more productive working on the sales floor, engaging with your customers.

• If you **bring in your holiday tonnage items early**, it will take enough pressure off of our warehouse selectors and loaders and trucks to help minimize late deliveries on those crucial last few days before the holiday weekend. This will help your department's efficiency and organization.

• **Order holiday semi-perishable and hard tonnage items early.** Plan on getting your tonnage items into your stores by the Tuesday before Easter.

• **Develop an off-hour or evening fill schedule for your hard goods.**

• **Stay ahead with tomato and banana color on hand** in order to have ready-to-eat, mature fruit on display. Consumers will want to consume this product immediately.

• Easter business can come late. Historically, **Friday and Saturday are busy days.**

CONVENTIONAL MARKET NEWS

APRIL MELON UPDATE



GOOD NEWS! **Cantaloupes** and **Honeydew** are in considerable supply with later plantings coming on with good harvest volumes out of Costa Rica and Honduras to kick off April.

Smaller fruit on both **Cantaloupes** and **Honeydews** (12ct and 6ct) will be promotable for April. Keep an eye out for spot buys on XL and Jumbo fruit too. Del Monte's **MAG-nificent Cantaloupes** will also be in great supply and are popular for their sweet taste and dense deep color flesh.

Looking ahead, new crop **Melons** from Mexico and Texas will tentatively start at the beginning of May. First of the season Florida **Athena-style Cantaloupes** are now available to start loading in April. There will mostly be 150ct and 120ct sizing on bins.

New crop Florida **Seedless Watermelons** are coming into season! Pricing is easing off as more growers are set to begin each week. Quality has been excellent and will continue to improve. When the weather warms up here in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, expect good consumer demand!



CV CITRUS

25ct 18lb trays and 12/2lb bags of **SUMO brand Dekopon Citrus** will be available through mid-April. The **SUMO** season is winding down. What will still be available throughout April and at some promo pricing will be **Mighty brand Dekopon Citrus** with 28ct on 18lb trays.

“Tango” variety **Halos brand Mandarins** from CA are peaking again on 28's after the rain moved most growers into smaller fruit. Import **Mandarins** remain in-stock in 10/3lb and 15/2lb options and are super promotable through April.

NOTE: Grapefruit has finished from Florida with minimal fruit with inconsistent sizing floating around. Texas **Grapefruit** are winding down as well as larger fruit is finishing up first. The CA desert crop (Star Rubies) are up and running with excellent quality and peaking on 40's.

Minneola Tangelos are peaking on 100's-125's with 64's and 80's being extremely tight, however we are in stock through Sunkist! This crop will go through April and into May.

Golden Nuggets (10/3lb) are in stock and peaking on large/jumbo/mammoth fruit so promote away here.

Sunkist **Pixie Tangerines** will be in stock the first week of April in bulk and bagged (16/1lb) options, promote right away as this crop has come on strong with the delay from the rain!



CV ORANGES

GOOD NEWS! For April, there will be abundant supplies of “Vintage Sweets” **Heirloom Navel Oranges** to promote in 3lb bags at pricing much lower than at the start of the season. Contact your rep to plan ads or promos on this high-flavor peak season fruit!

Overall, **Navel Oranges** are still peaking on 72's/88's with good supply on smaller fruit and choice options, while large fruit remains tighter. This market will firm up on pricing as we enter April. The California **Navel** crop looks to go through early July at this point.

Blood Oranges are in excellent supply and fruit is showing deep red color and eating great! This crop will go through July.

Cara Cara Oranges are peaking on smaller fruit (72's-113's) with larger fruit tight due to the rain. This crop will go through mid-June and will be a great item to push in April.



CV BERRIES

NOTE: Blackberry prices seem to hold steady ahead of the Easter holiday. Supplies are on the tighter side as demand is strong and harvests slow down due to natural growing cycles.

ALERT! Blueberries are extremely tight with limited quantities available. Domestic production has lightly started and is expected to increase quickly once harvests are ready. Expect light supplies heading into Easter with limits and pro-rates possible. **OUTLOOK:** Prices will become more promotable by the end of April as the USA crops come on.

ALERT! Raspberry prices have turned and increased with shorter supplies very quickly. A natural gap in growing cycles hit right has holiday demand picked up, so expect possible pro-rates and limits.

ALERT! Strawberry volumes are limited and falling really short of demand. Florida has finished for the season. California growers are about 6-8 weeks behind after the atmospheric rivers have pummeled the growing regions and many fields have been completely flooded.

It is still raining in CA, but forecasts show clear skies for the first week of April to hopefully give fields a chance to rebound and dry out. Expect poor fill rates and prorates heading into Easter. Quality out of CA has been nice with big berries so far, but after all the rain we could see quality and shelf-life challenges during April, which is not normal.



CV PEARS

Bartlett Pears will transition smoothly over the first couple of weeks of April as Washington fruit finishes and imports begin.

New crop Chilean **Asian, Comice, and Forelle Pears** have arrived. Good supplies should be expected.

Washington **Anjou Pears** continue to be in excellent supply and should remain this way for the next couple of months.



LEMONS & LIMES

Lemons are showing outstanding quality, but prices will firm up on 115's and smaller as the crop is peaking on 75's/95's.

ALERT! **Limes** remain volatile with less volume in Mexico. Production next week will be drastically scaled back for Holy Week leaving the weeks after even more limited. We should see an increase in volume and price relief headed into May.



CV POTATOES

ALERT! "Tasteful Selections" **Mini Potatoes** continue to have challenges with raw product shortages out of California. Until new crop arrives closer to June, "Tasteful Selections" will be cutting back all orders to 60% of a three month average weekly amount.

We have seen some upward pricing pressure on all large count **Russet Potatoes** this week out of Idaho due to sizing profile being much smaller with product peaking as a 100ct and smaller.



CV PINEAPPLES

NOTE: **Pineapple** supplies will be tight for Easter.

Del Monte **HoneyGlow Pineapples** will be limited for the start of April as well. Dole's **NEW Golden Selection Pineapples** will help fill in for

ALERT! Del Monte **PinkGlow Pineapples** will be out of stock until at least the middle of April.



CV ASPARAGUS

The deals on **Asparagus** from Caborca, Mexico are mostly sold through and the only special pricing left to promote for Easter is on small/pencil gauge sizing.

NOTE: Standard and large gauge sizes **Asparagus** are firming up heading into Easter, and pricing is back up too. Mexico is slowing down and fields are finishing up. 11lb and 28lb cases are available.

Local **Asparagus** out of DE or NJ is expected to start around 4/15 with peak season through the month of May.



CV SWEET CORN

GOOD NEWS! Spring crop **Sweet Corn** prices are becoming more affordable with plenty of quality product coming out of Florida.

Right now, we have packaged **Sweet Corn** along with bulk **White, Yellow, and Bi-color Sweet Corn.**

As the weather begins to warm and people get out their grills, be prepared for increased demand on **Sweet Corn!**



CV CUCUMBERS

GOOD NEWS! **Euro and Mini Seedless Cucumbers** will be promotable into the middle of April with new crop Canadian. Quality is outstanding.



CV GREEN BEANS

Green Bean prices have dropped back off slightly as we head into Easter. We can expect the market to fall again after the holiday. Quality has been excellent out of Florida and availability is steady at this time.



CV MANGOS

"**Champagne**" **Ataulfo Honey Mangos** will be steady for March in a 14ct premium pack on this beautiful fruit.

NOTE: **Round Mangos** have just not come on quick enough in Mexico to meet demand. Pricing is on the higher side.



CV CAULIFLOWER

Cauliflower is in good shape to kick off April, but more limited supplies are expected for the rest of the month.



CV LETTUCE

Some grower shippers are already starting to clean up on **Lettuces** and raise their pricing as they move production to the Salinas Valley of California which has been devastated by rain and flooding.

ALERT! After Easter, most grower shippers expect to be more limited and higher priced. The **Lettuce** category will be very unpredictable and spotty the month of April and into May.



CV SNACKING TOMATOES

GOOD NEWS! **Grape Tomatoes** and **Rainbow/Medley Mini Tomatoes** are in abundant supply for April with lots of spot buys popping up on various specialty packs. Keep an eye out for inflation buster in-store opportunities!



CV GRAPES

Grapes prices are still reasonable for price points but no longer at the extra low points we saw in mid to late March.

Peru is finishing up and Chile remaining the only player in the game. While supply is not the issue, as there is still an abundance of fruit in/arriving to the states, prices will increase with **Green Grapes** becoming firm. There are still spot deals available for **Red Grapes** in early April.

There is a US Grape Marketing Order: All import **Grapes** that enter US waters after April 10th must pass US#1 grade or need to be reconditioned, reexported, or destroyed. Fruit will arrive after the marketing order but growers typically only ship near perfect condition.



CV PEPPERS

GOOD NEWS! 11b **Hothouse Color Bell Pepper** prices are coming down with new crop Canadian **Peppers** having started along with Mexican product through the month of April. We continue to carry XL and Jumbo size **Peppers**.

GOOD NEWS! 15lb **Elongated Red Sweet Peppers** will increase in volume as we head into April out of Mexico. Quality has been excellent.

GOOD NEWS! **Jumbo Green Peppers** are promotable out of Florida. There is very little product coming out Mexico at this time and Florida is driving Mexico pricing down. Quality is good both out of Mexico and Florida.



CV TOMATOES

GOOD NEWS! **Heirloom Tomatoes** out of Mexico will remain abundant and promotable along with new crop Canada flushing again. This will be promotable as we head into the middle of April. Availability is increasing and quality is outstanding.

GOOD NEWS! **Vine Ripe Tomato** prices will be promotable into middle of April. We will continue with 2-layers out of Mexico but will start transitioning our 25lb vine ripe packs to product out of Florida. Quality will be excellent from both regions.

GOOD NEWS! **Roma Tomato** prices have been steady with product out of Mexico and pricing is on the floor. There is product out of Mexico and Florida, and quality is fantastic.

GOOD NEWS! **Cluster and Beefsteak Tomatoes** are promotable with new crop starting out of NY and Canada. This market will be promotable into middle of April. Quality has been excellent and there is still product out of Mexico, Canada, and US (Ohio and NY).

OTHER STORIES

- **ALERT!** **Sweet Baby Broccoli** is limited for April. Expect product gaps.

- Import **Peaches** and **Nectarines** will finish for the season by early April and will gap until California gets started in mid-May.

- Hothouse **Rhubarb** came and went. Field-grown Rhubarb out of Washington should start in mid-April.

- Back in stock! **Pomegranates** will be back in stock with Chilean fruit finally arriving to the east coast in time for Easter! Four Seasons will offer a single layer option! **Imported Pomegranate Arils** will be available.

- Good **Celery** supplies are expected into mid-April. "Seeder" is expected to start showing April into May, which might affect prices.
