ORGANIC STONE FRUIT OUTLOOK









California Organic Apricots continue in season, but we will be transitioning into fresh crop Stemilt Washington grown fruit starting around July 5th. New this week -16/1lb clamshells of **Organic Apricots** from Homegrown.

ALERT! Washington Organic Dark Sweet Cherries have been significantly delayed by weather. Fill-rates will be sporadic until early to mid-July.

Organic Rainier Cherries survived the rain and cool better and are therefore slightly more promotable leading up to the first full week of July. Quality on the Organic Rainier Cherries has been outstanding.

California Organic White & Yellow Nectarines and Peaches have been delayed in loading for pre 4th of July promotions as growers are waiting for their next varieties to ripen up and be harvested. Washington grown Organic Peaches and Nectarines may start by mid to late July.

Eastern Organic Peaches out of South Carolina are in a small gap, but more are expected here in late June.

California Organic Donut Flat Peaches are in peak season with the Galaxy variety!

Organic Black and Red Plum supplies are improving as peak season hit its stride. Organic Pluots are available in lighter supply now but will improve in early July when the Dapple variety is ready.

NEW! For the first time, Organic Verry Cherry Plums will be available to the marketplace. This plum and cherry cross is very sweet and snackable. We'll be offering them starting July 2 in 10/11b clamshells.



OG GREENS & LETTUCES

Lady Moon Farms from Chambersburg, PA, is harvesting their full line-up of Local Organic Greens and Leaf Lettuces. Although the Organic Leaf Lettuce season will draw to a close in late June or early July. Look for these local items to start with excellent quality and Organic Greens volume will continue to grow heading into July.

Expect to see East Coast and other Pennsylvania product to supplement what is limited to start Lady Moon's PA season before they get up to full production. As the PA Organic Lettuce season closes in early July, look for New York, Vermont, and Quebec seasons to pick up!

Organic Romaine Hearts are in steady supplies as June is ending. Although some vendors are completely without or very limited, expect to see consistent supplies for the remainder of June and into July as the Quebec season has now kicked off! Pricing is expected to take a tick up because for some suppliers being limited.



OG BERRIES

Driscoll's Organic Blackberries out of California and Mexico are in steady supply but are expected to firm as most other shippers wrap up out of Mexico. Expect prices to rise slightly over the next few weeks but then return with peak supply in August.

NOTE: Driscoll's Organic Blueberries got extremely tight out of California due to the high heat.

The Pacific Northwest Organic Blueberries have been delayed but will start to ramp up for peak July production. Until then, Organic Blueberries will remain in lighter supply.

Local New Jersey Organic Blueberries are set to begin just before July 4th, but growers seem uncertain about their overall crop outlook.

Organic Raspberries are in steady supply.

Organic Strawberries continue in season out of Central California. As the season moves on, we are seeing smaller berry size and Driscoll's is tightening their quality specs to make sure the fruit can hold up for the East Coast trip. Pricing is still reasonable but less promotable than mid-June.



OG MELONS

Organic Galia, Cantaloupe, and Honeydew continue in season from Southern California with very nice quality and flavor, however demand exceeds supply. The new growing region further north in the San Joaquin Valley will start in mid-July.

Organic Mini Seedless Watermelons will be in this week with limited availability as harvests out of California are just beginning. Quality is expected to be very nice for July promotion.

ALERT! Organic Seedless Watermelons will be in extremely short supply for the week leading up to 4th of July as Mexico has wrapped up for the season. Plantings in California are starting late and may not make it here before the 4th of July. Things should return to promotability for mid-July.



OG GRAPES

Mexican Organic Black, Green, and Red Seedless Grapes continue in strong supply, but some growers are struggling with quality here at the end of their season, so we're paying the premium to get the best.

Mexican **Organic Sweet Sapphire Grapes** (elongated black) are in season.

Mexican **Organic Cotton Candy Grapes** are available in very limited supply and are expected to be done in early to mid-July.

OUTLOOK: There is a good crop of California **Organic Grapes** on the vines which should start mid-July.



OG TOMATOES

Organic Grape Tomatoes from Lady Moon Farms continue to be promotable out of GA this week! Quality is exceptional.

ALERT! Organic Beefsteak and **Cluster Tomatoes** will be very tight this week.

Prices are high as availability is very short with greenhouses beginning their planned clean outs for fall and winter crops. Additionally, other-greenhouses are battling Covid-19 related staffing issues or closures. Mexico is shipping very little to nothing continue to put pressure out of Canada.



OG FIGS

Organic Black Mission Figs will be available for the end of June and into beginning of July! This early summer season is short so be sure to stock up while you can.



OG POTATOES

New crop bagged **Organic Russet Potatoes** have started this week. Pricing will jump significantly from old crop Colorado pricing to the new California price. **Organic Count Russet Potatoes** will get started around the 4th of July. Expect pricing on this item to jump significantly.

Organic Red and **Gold Potatoes** are going steady this week as well with product coming out of the Bakersfield, CA growing region at this time. Quality on both colors is outstanding, and **Organic Gold Potatoes** seem to be more limited in supply than their **Red Potatoes** counterparts.



OG CABBAGE

Organic Green and Red Cabbage is in steady supply heading into July. Joseph Weaver, from Ephrata, PA, continues to see volumes grow and as we enter July, Christ King from Lancaster, PA will begin harvesting his Organic Cabbage as well. Although Organic Red Cabbage from PA remains fairly limited, volumes are expected to grow in early July.

Organic Savoy and **Napa Cabbage** from California still remain limited and priced high; however, we are starting to see some local **Organic Savoy Cabbage.** Expect pricing to remain elevated and possible gaps in supplies.



OG BROCCOLI

ALERT! Like with many other vegetables, **Organic Broccoli** growers planted less product at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. We are now feeling some of those effects. **Organic Broccoli** and **Crowns** are very limited out west and expensive.

Local **Organic Stalk Broccoli** from in Lancaster County, PA is in stock for early July.



OG CAULIFLOWER

Organic Cauliflower is in limited supply with high pricing from California. Expect this difficult market situation to continue until fresh crop product is available from Quebec and Nevada around mid-July.

Organic Orange, Purple, and Naked Cauliflower from our local PA growers began in mid-June, although supplies will be limited look to get these items in your store.



OG CITRUS

Peruvian **Organic Satsuma Mandarins** are available and will be in limited sporadic supply.

ALERT! California and Mexican **Organic Lemon** supplies are extremely tight with high prices. Expect mostly good choice fruit out of Mexico.

California **Organic Valencia Oranges** have gotten some heat stress and smaller sizing will prevail.



OG GREEN BEANS

NOTE: Georgia **Organic Green Beans** are winding down and rising in price as we conclude June. As we enter July, look for price to remain elevated and from various regions before local PA **Organic Beans** begin in mid-July.



OG SWEET CORN

Organic White Sweet Corn from California has begun to see excellent quality and supplies and will be promotable leading up to the 4th of July.



OG PEPPERS

NOTE: Organic Green Peppers from California have started, before local season starts. Look for supplies to be limited and pricing expensive as we enter July, all while remaining excellent in quality.

NOTE: Organic Red, Yellow, and Orange Bell Peppers remain expensive heading into July. For Holland grown Organic Peppers, air freight still remains the biggest challenge, while Canadian product still remains limited and expensive as a result.

ALERT! Organic Mini Sweet Peppers from Mexico has seen a decrease in supplies in mid-June and now has begun to gap in late June and into early July. Look for pricing to be on the rise.

- Organic Butternut Squash continues to be in plentiful supply out of Mexico. We will see the first of Bakersfield, CA grown Organic Spaghetti Squash towards the middle of this week and quality will be much improved over the desert grown product that we have seen the last few weeks.
- ALERT! Organic Pom Arils will be out of stock long term starting in early July with no Pom Arils available until early fall. Nothing will be available over the summer.



OG EGGPLANT

Organic Eggplant from Lady Moon Farms in Georgia is seeing strong volumes and nice quality.



OG TROPICALS

Organic Tommy Atkins Mangos will be very promotable. This will be a great month to promote as supplies are coming on strong! Look for a great deal on 10ct **Organic Mangos** for the beginning of July.

Organic Ataulfo Honey Mangos are winding down in supply but should still be available for early July.

Organic Fair-Trade Haitian Mangos continue to be available in good volume. This has been our best year yet.

Organic Pineapple volume will be good for the beginning of July. We will have a few 5ct, and some 7 and 8ct fruit.

Organic Hass Avocados from California saw the biggest price jump over the past few weeks as prices rose significantly. Transportation costs also have increased due to holiday volume. California's supply is winding down along with Mexico and Peru. There will be enough fruit in the marketplace to prevent from gapping until Mexico's "Flora Loca" season hits in about a month.

48ct and 60ct **Organic Fair-Trade Hass Avocados** from Peru! Do your part to help these Fair-Trade farmers reap the benefits of their hard work. Peruvian fruit should be available through July.

OTHER STORIES

- ALERT! Organic Asparagus prices are rising some as product becomes more limited. Quality has looked good out of Mexico.
- Organic Brussels Sprouts from Mexico remain in steady supply. However, pricing has begun to be on the rise. Expect consistent supplies and excellent quality, with elevated pricing to start July.



OG LOCAL SPECIALTY VEG

Be on the lookout for some cool local items such as Organic Fava Beans, Gold Bar Squash, Patty Pan Squash, English Peas, and PA grown Stem Broccoli and Colored Cauliflower!



OG CUCUMBERS

Look for excellent quality, but limited supplies in early July on **Organic Cucumbers** from Lady Moon Farms in Georgia.

Organic Cucumber from Mexico are also still in excellent production in late June at a cheaper price point.

Organic Euro Seedless Cucumbers continue to see steady numbers, but pricing has begun to level out in June and is expected to take a jump in early July.

NOTE: Organic Mini Seedless Cucumbers due to weather conditions and labor demands has seen pricing increase and will continue to remain elevated into July.

 Organic Celery from the West coast is in steady supplies in late June. Supplies and pricing begin to improve in mid-June, however as we enter July expect pricing to level off. Heading into July, product from Nevada and more California growing regions will increase supplies and quality will remain good.



As States and counties are moving through different phases of COVID-19 restrictions, we can definitely see changes in shopping patterns. So, how will this affect this years July 4th celebrations? Nobody knows at this point. One thing is for sure, customers are looking for a reason to celebrate. Small gatherings and family get-togethers might how most people celebrate the holiday. Outdoor BBQ's should be the expectation.

Here are some ideas to help prepare your department, create excitement and drive sales on items your customers will be looking for.



Planning Your Orders

Don't wait until the last minute to fill your cooler and back rooms or you might be caught with empty shelves and be waiting on a delivery to satisfy your customers. Four Seasons Produce will be delivering on a standard schedule for the week before and of the 4th of July.

FRIDAY 6/26 & SATURDAY 6/27 DELIVERIES"

Order your hard goods such as croutons, dips, dressings, snacks, juices, etc) to arrive this day. Get 'em in and pack 'em out early so you're not messing around with these areas of your department during the busiest times of the selling period.

SATURDAY 6/27 & SUNDAY 6/28 DELIVERIES:

If you wait until Wednesday, 7/1 to bring in our heaviest orders, you'll be waiting on trucks for product that you need to sell that day. The heavy surge of customers will begin on July 1st and pick up momentum as you get further into the holiday weekend.

WEDNESDAY 7/1 - FRIDAY 7/3 DELIVERIES:

Bring in your refill of ad items, highly perishables and product to cover your weekend sales.

Mass displays are going to sell product, so don't be bashful. Keep your displays full!

Sweet Corn

ALERT! Sweet Corn is at an all-time high price for this time of year, but it is still selling well. Still, if you are looking at last year's movement that was likely at a better price-point. So, you'll want to adjust down slightly.

To satisfy demand you will need to build a secondary display of corn using a bin dummied up to control your display quantities. To make very good margin, trim, strip and tray pack 5 ears of corn and get a premium retail for the added value and convenience.

NEW JERSEY BLUEBERRY SEASON





Blueberries are in good supply from New Jersey, and volumes will continue to increase over the next week. We'll have Jersey Fruit brand, as well as some Driscoll's brand with proprietary genetics grown in the Garden State.

Growers are getting higher than expected prices at the start of the season, but we still think this is a great time to feature these local berries prominently.

Quality and flavor have been excellent so far.



CV BERRIES

Strawberries are in steady supply out of Watsonville, Salinas, and Santa Maria, CA, but demand has really picked up. Pricing will begin to climb slightly as we head in early July on all 8/1lb and 4/2lb clamshells.

We will continue to have access to Driscoll's Limited Edition **Rosé** and "**Sweetest Batch" Strawberries** all week. Keep promoting these beautiful berries sold in 16/10 oz clamshells.

Raspberries and Blackberries will be steady all week from California. Sizing and quality have been excellent. We will continue to have plenty of large pack 12 oz Raspberries all week.



CV STONE FRUIT

NOTE: Many Cherry growers are still oversold because of strong demand going into July 4th and the slow start to the crop. We are getting some out, but the spot market is higher. Peak volume should be hitting after the holiday.

Rainier Cherries are in peak season and have very nice quality so far.

NOTE: Most **Eastern Peach** growers are in a gap between varieties and many are sold out until early July. Supplies will be more limited until mid-July.

California White & Yellow Peaches and Nectarines continue in peak season.

Red and **Black Plums** are improving in volume and size. There are spot deals on small sizes.

CV ICEBERG LETTUCE

NOTE: Out West, **Iceberg Lettuce** prices are up due to weather, fringe burn, discoloration, and light mildew.

We'll be shifting much of our **Iceberg Lettuce** product to Quebec starting the week of 6/29. This product should be more affordable and will certainly be fresher due to proximity.



CV BROCCOLI

ALERT! Overall, **Broccoli Crowns** are very tight from all growing regions. Prices seem to continue to rise for most vendors. There are a few vendors that had a push of crops out of California and Mexico with the warmer weather.

There is now a large spread in the market, but this will be temporary. Use code 620. (Mainly CA, few fillers out of Mexico)



CV MANGOS

We are hitting a very promotable stretch on **Mangos** over the next couple of weeks. Mangoes will be available in 8, 10, and 12ct sizing. Look to push and promote!

Ataulfo Honey Mangos 14ct "Champagne" label fruit will be available through early to mid-July.

Haitian Mangos will be in good supply next week!



CVIFAFIFTTUCES

California - availability tightened, and prices bumped up a few dollars. Fewer plantings from back at the beginning of the pandemic are starting to reflect in supply vs demand. Romaine is the tightest commodity.

New Jersey - the season is coming to an end. They hope to harvest until the end of June (weather dependent)!

Quebec - fresh crop product is available, and quality is good! Prices are favorable.



OG GRAPES

Mexican **Grapes** are winding down, but the California Central Valley season is about to begin.

Cotton Candy Grapes from Mexico will be sold out by early July.

On **Red Seedless Grapes**, growers are struggling with color - many lots only having 65-75% red. You will see cheap prices on this kind of grape. The Delano, CA area will begin around July 10th.

On **Green Seedless Grapes**, a little better on volume with late varieties, like the **Sweet Globe Grapes**, and will run through the start in Delano. There are a lot of smaller **Greens** with little demand that are cheaper.



CV MELONS

NOTE: Athena-style Cantaloupes are selling out fast, but we have plenty booked for the beginning of July, so we should be in good shape.

NOTE: California and Arizona **Cantaloupe** growers are dealing with a smaller crop harvest due to planting less because of the uncertainty over Covid-19 and a major shortage of labor.



CV ROMAINE HEARTS

The demand on **Romaine Hearts** out of California has been strong and most vendors are selling out daily.

Fresh crop Quebec **Romaine Hearts** are now in season at reasonable pricing. Quality is good.



CV PEPPERS

ALERT! Green Peppers remain extremely tight this week. Georgia is all but finished. California has very little supplies. North Carolina will start with new crop but will be light in volume. Pricing will remain high and supplies limited.

NOTE: 11lb Red, Yellow, and Orange Bell Pepper prices are rising as crops are in a skip. Volume is very light coming out of Canada this week. Greenhouses also continue to battle Covid-19 issues, hurting production as well. We will have some Holland Peppers coming in light supplies.



CV SWEET CORN

ALERT! Sweet Corn prices should remain high this week. Fields in GA are closing daily leaving supplies even tighter than they have been. 4th of July demand should be strong. Quality has looked excellent.



CV CAULIFLOWER

NOTE: Cauliflower out of California continues to trade at higher prices due to lighter volumes.

There are a handful of PA local Cauliflower bins.



CV ONIONS

The USDA Farms to Families Box Program is putting a good amount of demand on all medium sized **Onions** — as a result we are seeing FOB prices on this size increase this week. We are also seeing **Bagged Onions** increase regionally as increased demand has pushed these prices up.



CV SPECIALTY

Red Cactus Pears from Mexico will be available again for the beginning of July. We sold out quickly so get your orders in!

Figs are available again for the beginning of July. Growers expect this early season to come and go fairly quickly so be sure to take advantage while you can!

Rambutan is available again for the beginning of July. This is coming out of Mexico and will be offered in a 5lb bulk pack!

Quince will be winding down after the end of June.

Dragon fruit, Yellow Pitahaya, Passion Fruit and **Guava** are among just a few tropical items that will be available for the beginning of July.



CV CELERY

Celery supplies have tightened and prices are up headed towards early July.



CV ASPARAGUS

ALERT! Asparagus is extremely tight headed into July. Production in all regions is hampered by labor challenges due to Covid-19. Expect tight supplies and higher prices as we source from Mexico and Peru. Local is finished.



CV TOMATOES

High tunnel grown local **Vine Ripe Round Tomatoes** from Fifer Orchards in Delaware are available and look beautiful. Quality is fantastic.

NOTE: Beefsteak Tomatoes will be very tight this week. There are 2 holidays commanding demand in the USA and Canada. Greenhouse growers continue to battle Covid-19 labor issues and shut down production to contain the spread. Markets will be very high and product limited.

NOTE: Cluster Tomato markets jumped up drastically this week as demand picked up due to lack of Beefsteak tomatoes available. Holiday demand, greenhouses shutting down from Covid-19 are leaving limited volume available.



CV WATERMELONS

Watermelon markets will be tightening up this week ahead of July 4th. A lot of GA growers lost fields due to rain and harsh weather. Demand is very strong as well. Quality has looked very nice coming out of GA.



CV GREEN BEANS

NOTE: Green Bean prices remain high this week. Supplies remain tight as Georgia is finished for the season. Virginia fields are struggling to pick good yields. New Jersey will start in a small way this week as well

OTHER STORIES

NOTE: We are going to see a short gap in supply here on **Spaghetti Squash** due to sever quality issues in all growing regions. There is some supply around here on the east coast but the quality is #2 at best.

LOCAL: Super Select Cucumbers from New Jersey will be available this week. Volume will be light to start but kick in shortly. PA is expecting to start as well this week so local will be available to promote.

LOCAL: Green and **Yellow Squash** prices are falling rapidly as New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and North Carolina are all harvesting good numbers. Virginia also started, so product should be very promotable from all regions this week and quality excellent.

California **Navel Oranges** will probably run through early July but then we'll transition to **Valencia Oranges**. A few import **Navel Oranges** are coming in with the volume picking up after July 1st.

Hass Avocado prices from Mexico actually dropped very slightly with good volumes available. We are carrying a 40ct Peruvian **Hass Avocado** option at a nice low price as well.

Pineapples are in steady supply, but 5ct fruit will be limited. As summer progresses, large size fruit with be harder to come by.


