PROMOTABLE ORGANIC MANGOS



Organic Mango Mania is in full swing! It's time to push and promote **Organic Mangos**! Four Seasons Produce partnered with Crespo Organic Mangoes for a display contest and promo - enter today!

Organic Tommy Atkins Mangos are very promotable. Rain in Mexico briefly impacted **Organic Ataulfo Honey Mango** supplies, but product is expected back mid-July with steady availability.

Specialty **Organic Mangos** available: **Nam Doc Mai** and **Mallika**. Limited POS materials are available - ask your Four Seasons Rep for details.

Organic Dried Ataulfo and Red Mangos from Crespo Organics are back in stock for the 2025 season. Available in 4oz and 1lb bags, these are top-tier dried mango options with excellent packaging.



OG BERRIES

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Raspberries** from Baja and California are promotable with strong volume and excellent quality. Fruit is priced to sell.

Organic Blueberries continue to ship from the Pacific Northwest with increasing volumes and good quality. **NOTE: LOCAL** New Jersey season has ended due to rain and heat.

Organic Blackberries remain steady out of Watsonville, CA with strong quality and pricing.

LOCAL New Jersey growers will start to harvest **Organic Blackberries** for the week of July 14, but volumes are expected to be on the lighter side.

Organic Strawberries have pushed through their peak, and supplies are starting to pull back. Quality has been excellent from California.



OG MELONS

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Cantaloupes** and **Organic Honeydews** are in excellent supply. Sizing is peaking larger on both commodities, creating opportunities for more advantageous pricing on larger fruit.

Organic Seedless and Seeded Watermelons from California are in short supply due to chain demand. Pricing will ease slightly due to reduced freight costs.

Organic Mini Seedless Watermelons are available from the Carolinas and California with excellent quality.

Organic Mini Seeded Watermelons are available from the Carolinas for July with great pricing and quality despite weather challenges.



OG TOMATOES

LOCAL Organic Round and Roma Tomatoes have begun in limited volume from King Family Farms in Lancaster County, PA, with more volume expected late July into August.

LOCAL Organic Snacking Tomatoes remain light, creating small gaps and strong demand. Lady Moon Farms and NJ growers have started with limited supply on **LOCAL Organic Grape, Cherry, and Golden Grape Tomatoes**.

Organic Beefsteak Tomatoes are beginning to tighten as Canadian growers finish and replant. Prices are increasing but supply remains steady.



OG BROCCOLI

Organic Broccoli has started shipping from Canada with very nice quality. We will continue to carry California product, though Canadian pricing is more attractive.

Organic Sweet Baby Broccoli is in strong supply and priced for promotion. This is a great week to highlight this item.



OG STONE FRUIT

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Cherries** are still promotable with excellent quality, sizing, and pricing as the season winds down later this month.

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Peaches, Organic Nectarines, Organic Plums, and Organic Pluots** are in strong supply with exceptional quality. **Organic Yellow Peaches** and **Organic Black Plums** are especially abundant.



OG PEPPERS

LOCAL Organic Green Bell Peppers are in tighter supply as harvests begin from New Jersey and Pennsylvania, including Lady Moon Farms.

Organic Hothouse Color Peppers are tight with strong pricing from Canada. **Yellow** and **Orange** varieties remain limited, while **Red** is more readily available.



OG LETTUCE

GOOD NEWS! **Organic Iceberg Lettuce, Red Leaf, Green Leaf, and Romaine Lettuce** have all begun shipping from Quebec.

Quality has been outstanding, making this a great time to promote **Organic Lettuces**.



OG CUCUMBERS

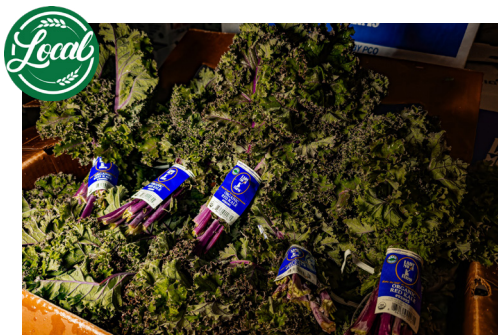
LOCAL Organic Cucumbers supplies are starting from New Jersey and Lady Moon Farms in Pennsylvania but will take 1-2 weeks to reach steady volume.

Organic Cucumbers have dropped in volume from the Southeast.



OG GRAPES

Organic Grapes will transition smoothly from Mexico to California in mid-July. There are no expected gaps across any color, and California prices are projected to open in parity with Mexico.



OG LOCAL GREENS

LOCAL Organic Kales and Collards from Lady Moon Farms in Chambersburg, PA remain in excellent supply and quality.



OG EGGPLANT

LOCAL Organic Eggplants are beginning out of New Jersey (Flaim Farms) and Pennsylvania (Lady Moon Farms). Volume will build slowly, but quality looks good. Specialty varieties are expected soon.



OG KIWIFRUIT

Organic Green and **SunGold Kiwifruit** are in steady supply in both clamshell and volume-filled cases.



OG SQUASH

LOCAL Organic Green Squash is in good supply from Pennsylvania and New Jersey, but **Organic Yellow Squash** volume is slightly lower. Quality has been nice on both.



OG ASPARAGUS

Organic Asparagus from Mexico continues to be promotable with strong supply, good quality, and affordable pricing.



OG SWEET CORN

Organic Sweet Corn remains available out of North Carolina, though fields are nearing completion.

LOCAL Organic Sweet Corn from Pennsylvania farms have started for the season but expect volumes to be light initially. Volume will continue to build as we move through July. Quality has been exceptional on local corn!



OG TROPICALS

Organic Pineapples are promotable heading into mid-July, with a focus on 8ct fruit.

Organic Royal Star Papayas are steady for mid-July.

Organic Young Thai Coconuts and **Brown Coconuts** (20ct) are both available throughout July.

Organic Yellow Pitahaya Dragon Fruit from Ecuador will be in limited supply mid-to-late July.

Organic Jackfruit will be available from Florida by late July in limited volumes. **Organic Mamey** and **Organic Sapodilla** are also available from Florida.

Organic Hass Avocados have tightened as the transition occurs from the Mexican Negra crop to the Flor Loca crop. Expect some shortages mid-July. Current Negra fruit is arriving firm-ripe with high oil content. Flor Loca fruit will arrive hard and green.



OG ONIONS

LOCAL Organic Red and **Candy Sweet Onions** from Christ King from Lancaster County, PA will begin arriving in limited supply for the week of 7/14 with more volume expected the next week.

Organic Vidalia Sweet Onions will finish as local product begins.

Peri & Sons **Organic Red Onions** will remain available in 16/3lb Earthbag packaging to provide a biodegradable bagged option.

OTHER STORIES

- **Organic Celery** from California remains steady into mid-July. Full-size 24ct, 30ct, and **Celery Hearts** are all available with excellent quality.

- **Organic Lemons** are experiencing sub-par quality during this time. It is recommended to limit shelf space and replenish often at the retail level.

- **Organic Valencia Oranges** are facing a drastic drop in crop volume. Markets are expected to rise throughout the summer.

- Import **Organic Bartlett** and **Organic Bosc Pears** are wrapping up, while **Organic Anjou Pears** remain available for a bit longer.

- **California Organic Bartlett Pears** are expected to start shipping at the end of July with East Coast availability by early August.

- **Organic Sweet Potatoes**, particularly the **Japanese #1** variety, are currently unavailable due to a gap in old crop supply from California. AV Thomas expects to dig the first field of new crop **Japanese Organic Sweet Potatoes** with arrivals expected to the East Coast by Friday, 7/18.

- **Organic Cosmic Crisp Apples** remain extremely limited.

CONVENTIONAL MARKET NEWS

JULY 11 - JULY 18, 2025

ABUNDANT CHERRIES



Cherries are flushing and pricing, size, and quality make an opportunity for great spot promotions and big displays.

Rainier Cherries are still available but past their peak.

Kyle's Pick Cherries, best of the season, are available from Stemilt.

LOCAL Yellow Peaches, White Peaches, and Nectarines are becoming available in better size and price out of New Jersey.

California is in peak season for **Yellow Nectarines** and **Peaches**. **White Nectarines** and **Peaches** are available with some varietal gaps.

All colors of **Plumcots** are available: **Green, Red, Black, and Mottled**.

LOCAL Pennsylvania Peaches are now available from Hollabaugh Bros.



CV TOMATOES

LOCAL Heirloom Tomatoes from PA grower Cedar Meadow Farms have begun and are available now with limited volume to start. Volume will continue to increase through July and August. Cedar Meadow grows regeneratively and offers a large **Heirloom** in a 15lb case and **Baby Heirlooms** in an 8/1 open top quart. Quality is exceptional.

LOCAL New Jersey grown **Vine Ripe Round** and **Snacking Tomatoes** are available with light volume to start. Quality is excellent. Expect volume to increase week over week through July. Delaware high tunnel grown **Rounds** also remain available with steady volume and excellent quality.

Snacking Tomatoes remain available with elevated markets. **Grapes** are coming out of Canada and Tennessee with light North Carolina production as well. **Cherry, Cocktail, and Medley Tomatoes** remain available with tight availability and stronger demand. Quality has been excellent.

Cluster Tomatoes will be promotable out of Canada. Quality continues to be nice, however there is heat damaged fruit in the marketplace. We will continue to source the best quality fruit.

Beefsteak Tomatoes remain available out of Canada. Pricing is increasing slightly after a recent heat wave hit the area, causing growers' yields to slow down. Quality remains nice.



CV MELONS

GOOD NEWS! **Cantaloupes** and **Honeydews** are in excellent supply out of California on all types. Quality has been outstanding with markets favorable, so continue to promote through the summer.

Seedless Watermelons will be in tighter supply here on the east coast for the week of 7/14, but better supplies are right around the corner. Market pricing is expected to remain steady through this brief drop in supply. Georgia is all but finished for the season, and fruit will mostly be sourced from the Carolinas and **LOCAL** Delaware.

Seeded Watermelons will become very tight heading into the following week. Heavy rainfall in Georgia and Carolinas has slowed harvest and diminished quality.

Mini Seedless Watermelons are available from the Carolinas, but supplies are limited. California also has some very nice fruit, but pricing is higher due to freight heading east.

Yellow Mini Seedless Watermelons will be back in supply starting week of 7/14.



CV BERRIES

GOOD NEWS! **Raspberries** continue to be promotable out of California and Baja. Strong harvests are creating good supply and aggressive pricing. Quality is excellent.

Blueberries remain steady from multiple regions. **LOCAL** New Jersey continues to harvest but may end abruptly due to weather. The Pacific Northwest is tighter but increasing in volume. Pricing is steady and quality is good.

LOCAL Driscoll's Sweetest Batch Blueberries out of New Jersey will begin in light volumes in mid-July.

Blackberries will remain tight as Mexico experiences heavy rains. California is shipping the most volume, with local pockets in PA and NJ starting. Quality has been nice and eating excellent.

Strawberries remain steady out of California. Volumes and pricing are steady as peak season winds down. Quality remains strong with excellent eating characteristics.



CV EGGPLANT & SQUASH

LOCAL Green Squash, Yellow Squash, and Gold Bar Squash are in good supply from New Jersey and PA.

LOCAL Eggplant has started out of New Jersey. Prices are elevated as rain in the southern regions reduced availability. Specialty Eggplant varieties are expected in mid to late July.



CV LOCAL VEG

LOCAL Greens and Cabbages remain steady out of New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

New crop product from Quebec will start soon, offering a good option as summer heat impacts cooler weather crops like Bok Choy.



CV CUCUMBERS

Cucumbers are scarce out of the Carolinas and Georgia due to heavy rains.

However, **LOCAL** New Jersey and Pennsylvania Cucumbers have started with good volume and nice quality.



CV MANGOS

Mexico experienced rain in some key Mango growing regions. Deals on 10 and 12ct fruit dissipated quickly as fruit has sized up from the rain making those smaller sizes more tight.

Kent variety fruit is becoming more prevalent during this time with a few Tommy Atkins variety fruit also available.



CV ONIONS

LOCAL PA Simply Sweet Onion season should start around the last week of July.

Until then, the Vidalia Sweet Onion season continues with excellent quality and attractive pricing. We are in the storage portion of the Vidalia crop, offering great skin set and overall quality. No gaps are expected before local Sweets begins.



CV LETTUCE

Romaine Lettuce is in steady supply from both California and Quebec. We'll be carrying both lines this month to provide both options. Pricing on the Canadian grown Romaine will be more promotable.

Iceberg Lettuce is in much tighter supply from California, and this is expected to last into mid-July. This is planned as California plants less acreage this time of year due to the Canadian growers supplying the east coast. Unfortunately, head size and weights for Canadian Iceberg Lettuce were much lighter than expected, and they couldn't harvest as expected. This slight pause in available supply has pushed up pricing. Canadian supplies should be back up and running in full speed the week of July 13th.



CV SWEET CORN

Sweet Corn availability tightened up very quickly as **LOCAL** growers hit harvests heavy for the 4th of July and Georgia finished for the season, creating a gap in supply. Pricing has increased given the increased demand.



CV GREEN BEANS

Green Beans are lighter in supply on the East Coast, but we have steady volume from **LOCAL** Lebanon, PA grower Ron Copenhaver.



CV CAULIFLOWER

Cauliflower supplies came up a bit shorter than expected this past week from California, and the market pricing started to move higher. We expect this pricing to remain higher for this week.



CV GRAPES

Grapes are finishing up in Mexico and starting in California. There will be no gap in color or sizing as we make the transition, however varieties to start in California will be more traditional.



CV BROCCOLI

Broccoli Crowns will remain in steady supply out of California as we head into mid-July. The quality has been very nice. Smith Farms, from Maine, will begin with their Eastern **Broccoli** season in mid-July.



CV BRUSSELS SPROUTS

Brussels Sprouts are in tighter supply and pricing has certainly been on the higher side. Look for this market to remain higher over the next week.



CV AVOCADOS

Hass Avocados from Mexico are in a bit of a transition. Flor Loca fruit has started but the majority of fruit is still from the Negra crop which is known for its creamy texture and high oil content. The Loca vs. Negra fruit will be a stark difference in the coming weeks as the Loca crop is very hard and green just making the minimum dry matter content for fruit entering the U.S. Peru continues to have fruit as well as a value option.

Reminder: Four Seasons offers Pre-conditioned fruit in all the sizes that we carry. This fruit will ripen more quickly for the consumer. Ripe fruit is a great way to drive incremental sales!



CV CITRUS

Summer **Citrus** is arriving in full swing with plentiful **Navels, Cara Caras, Mandarins,** and **Lemons** available from South America.

Navel Oranges from California are finished for the season with programmed sizes. We will have California **Valencia Oranges** or imported **Navel Oranges** to cover the gap.

Limes are seeing favorable markets allowing a push on all sizes from all regions. Continue to promote through July.



CV PEPPERS

Hothouse **Red, Orange,** and **Yellow Bell Pepper** demand remains strong. **Orange** and **Yellow** remain very short, but **Red** availability is steady. Pricing is expected to remain strong in mid-July.

Green Peppers have tightened significantly due to rain in the Carolinas and slow starts in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Expect at least a week of high pricing until local volumes increase.

Chili Peppers of all types are also affected by rains in southern regions. **Jalapeños** are particularly light in supply. **LOCAL** New Jersey is starting slowly and will help improve supply in mid-July.

OTHER STORIES

- **Count Russet Potato** prices continue to strengthen, particularly on large sizes. Smaller sizes, like 100ct and bags, remain unchanged. Expect larger product to continue to rise through the end of the old crop season.

- **Asparagus** out of Peru remains steady, with slight pockets of deals around. Quality has been sharp overall.

- California **Bartlett Pears** will begin shipping for arrival to the East Coast the week of 7/20. A good crop is expected. California **Bosc Pears** and **Red Pears** will become available toward the end of the month for shipping in August.

- California's first season of domestic **Figs** is now done. California will gap for about 3-4 weeks and we will see more again right around the end of July or early August.

- Both **Red Skin/White Flesh** and **Yellow Skin/White Flesh Dragon Fruit (Pitahaya)** are in good supplies for the middle of July. Pricing is promotable.

- **Pineapple** supplies are tightening for the summer months. Expect pricing to rise, especially in the **HoneyGlow** variety from Del Monte which will be very limited. Expected prorates over the next few months.

- **Passion Fruit** and **Star Fruit** are available again from Florida for the summer!

- **Green** and **SunGold Kiwifruit** from Zespri are in steady supplies. Be sure to offer clamshell and loose fruit in both varieties for your customers.

- **Hard Squash**, such as **Acorn**, is now done out of Mexico. **Butternut** and **Spaghetti** are still in ample supply and should remain steady in terms of price and availability for the next several weeks.



ROOTED IN REGENERATION.

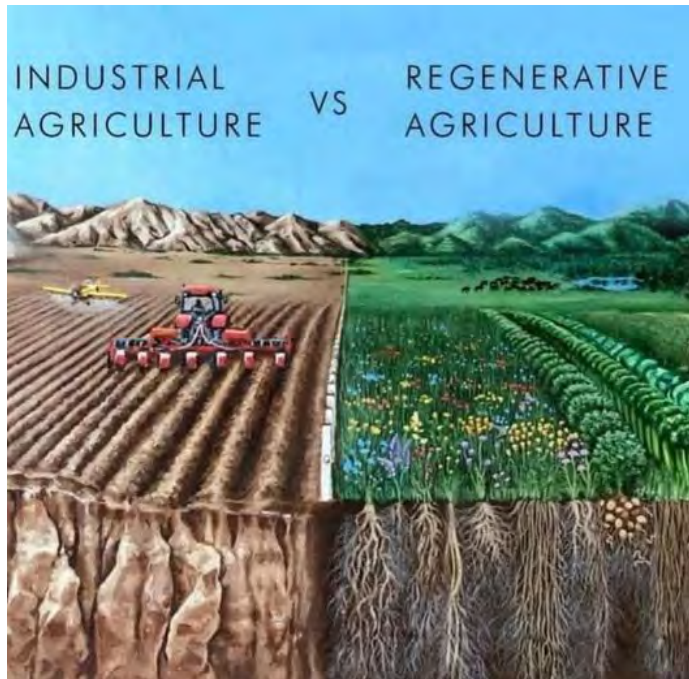
Cedar Meadow Farms is operated by the Steve Groff and his family in Lancaster County, PA. He pioneered the “Permanent Cover Cropping System” to enhance soil and water quality, along with reducing pesticides. Fresh produce is grown on 200 acres of land that was purchased by his grandparents in 1935 – a legacy that the 4th generation is beginning to manage.

Very simply, cover crops are specific crops that they plant in the off-season on the very same fields where they grow our cash-crops (gourds, pumpkins, tomatoes...) These cover crops provide a “cover” during the winter and spring seasons to protect their fields. The living roots that dig into the soil year-round infuse it with nutrients, replacing what was removed during harvest.

The roots also create healthy soil that’s resistant to run-off during rain, protecting the surrounding water shed and providing immensely better water far down-stream. This is all done in place of traditional tilling, which simply turns the soil over with no added or long-term benefit. No-till farming is much more work, but the long-term benefit is enormous. After 30+ years of cover-cropping, the fields planted help grow better, more nutrient-rich plants.
