

ABUNDANT ORGANIC BRUSSELS SPROUTS

Organic Brussels Sprouts are in abundant supply out of Mexico. Quality has been very good! Product supplies and pricing may tighten up some in early March.

8/11b microwaveable Organic Brussels Sprouts bags are also in good volume.





OG STRAWBERRIES & BLUEBERRIES

Promotable **Organic Strawberry** are expected for mid-March from Mexico and California. But in the meantime, rain and cool weather has slowed production.

Florida growers are into better volume on **Organ**ic Strawberries for early March.

Driscoll's **Organic Blueberries** are in excellent supply with steady markets and promotional opportunities now available. South American **Organic Blueberry** supplies continue in pint clamshells.



OG BLACKBERRIES & RASPBERRIES

Driscoll's **Organic Blackberries** are back in good supply with prices easing down. Big promotional opportunities are expected in March.

Other brands of **Organic Blackberries** continue with steady supplies out of Mexico. Tighter markets should be expected in March with slightly higher prices.

ALERT! Driscoll's **Organic Raspberry** prices back up in price. It will be April until volumes improve.



OG TOMATOES

Organic Cluster Tomatoes are increasing in supply and prices have begun to drop. Volumes should continue to increase. Organic 15lb Hothouse Tomatoes are limited.

Organic Cherry, Rainbow Cherry, and Grape Tomatoes are in good supply out of Florida. Prices are steady. Organic Grape Tomatoes are abundant out of Mexico with cheap prices.

Organic 2-Layer Round Tomatoes are in adequate supply out of both Mexico and Florida. Mexican pricing dropped more quickly than Florida. Quality is very good.

Organic Roma Tomatoes are increasing in supply this week out of Mexico. Prices are lower. Florida is in adequate supply.



OG KALE

Organic Green, Lacinato, and **Red Kale** are in abundant supply out of CA. Quality is good.

Product out of Florida is increasing in supply this week.



OG BROCCOLI

ALERT! Slow growth in the fields, due to cold weather, has limited supplies of **Organic Broccoli** and **Broccoli Crowns**. Pricing is on the way up. Early to mid-March could be a period of higher prices and limited availability.



OG PEARS

Import Organic Bartlett Pears supplies are ramping up. Expect prices to go down. Organic Red Bartlett Pears will become available in March.

Washington **Organic Red Anjou** will wrap up for the season here in early March.



OG CUCUMBERS

Organic Cucumbers are in better supply this week out of Mexico. Pricing has moved down somewhat. Florida will begin here in early March.

Organic Hothouse Cucumbers out of Mexico are in tighter supply, but prices are steady.



OG PEPPERS

Mexican growers report limited supplies of all colors of **Organic Colored Bell Peppers.** Price has moved up sharply due to high demand and low supply. Quality is good overall, but some arrival issues have been noted.

Organic Colored Bell Pepper quality continues to be very good out of Israel.

Florida growers are more limited on **Organic Green Peppers** this week, but Mexico has very good supplies.



OG SQUASH

ALERT! With the cold weather, the Mexican Organic Zucchini and Yellow Squash prices shot up \$11 this week. Most shippers report very little coming in from harvests, and product is not growing as fast due to the cooler temp.

Product from Florida is also limited, but **Organic Zucchini** should increase here in early March. Prices are up.



OG GREEN BEANS

Organic Green Beans are in slightly better supply out of Mexico this week. Prices are still high.

Florida growers have **Organic Green Beans** again this week and should be available for March. Prices are lower this week.



OG HASS AVOCADOS

Organic Hass Avocados will continue to be in steady supply with pricing also remaining steady.

Fair Trade Organic Hass Avocado supplies from OKE's Equal Exchange program should be good here in early March.



OG ASPARAGUS

Organic Asparagus supplies did not decline after the rain and cold weather. Mexican product still priced low. All arrivals have been of good quality.

California will load in early March.

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OG GRAPES

South African 10 Ib Organic Green and Black Grapes are in firm supply this week.

A small late-season 18lb. **Organic Grape** deal out of Peru is available. Expect very tight supplies for a couple of weeks and then they will be done for the season.



OG MANGOS

Organic Kent Mangos from Peru are winding down. The last of the Peruvian fruit will ship this week and small amounts of Mexican Organic Tommy Atkins Mangos will begin to load in Texas in early March. The pricing will be a bit higher on the Mexican fruit to start the season.

Organic Ataulfo Mangos from Mexico remain in good supply. The crop is sizing bigger than it had been to start and will transition into bigger sized fruit for early March! Pricing should remain steady.

• **Organic Spinach** is in better supply this week. Pricing is down somewhat, but is expected to increase here in early March. Quality is very good.

• CA growers have adequate supplies of Organic Red, Green, and Napa Cabbage. Organic Red and Green Cabbage are in good supply out of Florida.

• **Organic Pineapple** supplies are still somewhat tight as rainy weather in Costa Rica has caused production to slow down.

• California Organic Grapefruit continues in steady supply.



OG POTATOES

The sizing profile on **Count Russet Potatoes** continues to be very small. We will also see some sporadic supply gaps this week as we transition out of Colorado and over to Washington.

Quality should look nice but price is going to start to increase as supply is starting to become more limited.



OG LETTUCE

Organic Red Butter, Green Butter, Green Leaf, and Romaine Lettuces are in good supply out of Florida. Organic Red Leaf Lettuce is more limited this week. Quality is excellent.

All varieties are in good supply out of CA, but product is still showing discoloration on the ribs and some of the leaves.

ALERT! Organic Romaine Heart prices are skyhigh with very little product to load. Shippers have reportedly moved through much of their volume and are now waiting for more fields to become available to harvest. The cold has slowed growth.



OG CAULIFLOWER

ALERT! Organic Cauliflower prices shot up with cooler temperatures, which slowed harvests. Prices are expected to go even higher next week. Quality overall has been better this week.

Organic Romanesco is in good supply out of CA.



OG CELERY

Organic Celery is in good supply out of Mexico and California, but prices have started to move up.

Organic Celery Hearts are in abundant supply, but prices are up as well. Quality may become an issue due to the rain and cold weather.

Organic Celery Root (Celeriac) is in good supply out of CA.

OTHER STORIES:

• Prices are starting to come down on Organic and All-Natural Young Thai Coconuts as supplies are going up.

• Organic Formosa Papayas have been in steady supply with excellent quality.

• ALERT! Cooler weather has inhibited growing of Organic Baby Arugula and a few other Organic Lettuces for Organic Packaged Salads for early March. A few prorates can be expected.

• Organic Eggplant is in adequate supply Mexico. Florida product is limited. • Organic Cilantro is in adequate supply out of CA and Mexico. Price has moved back down.

• ALERT! Organic Lime supplies are on the way down with prices on the way up due to rain and cooler weather. Expect this trend to continue.

• CA **Organic Lemon** supplies will be better this week. The early Mexican start showing a little pressure. **Organic Meyer Lemons** continue in good, steady supply with promotional opportunities available.



Within each category the items will typically be arranged in alphabetical order or by brand program.

FLORIDA STRAWBERRY FLASH SALES



Major deals on **Florida Strawberries** will continue through this week. Growers are needing to promote extra volumes from late February and the very beginning of March.

NOTE: Some cooler weather is expected this week which should help to slow the increased volume we have been seeing.

California production is very limited due to the cool weather in the West. Look for markets to gain a little strength after this week.



COLD WEATHER OUT WEST

ALERT! Cold weather from Mexico, to Yuma, AZ, up into the Salinas Valley of California is causing Vegetable supply gaps and quality issues across the board. All items are affected: Lettuces, Broccoli, Cauliflower, Asparagus, etc.

Prices will be high and supplies will be limited until at least the 3rd week of March. Stay tuned for more updates.



CV PEPPERS

Green Peppers became extremely active at the tail end of February. Cold weather in Mexico really slowed production, and supplies out of Florida can't offset the supply that was crossing from Mexico. Prices have jumped significantly on all sizes of **Green Peppers**. Mexican growers are saying that supplies will improve by mid-March.

Field-Grown Sweet Red Peppers are also very tight out of Mexico. Look for pricing to rise here as well this week.

Hothouse Bell Peppers have also jumped up in pricing as supplies have dipped. Product out of Ontario has started, but in a small way. Look for excellent quality on these new crop Canadian bells.



CV TOMATOES

New crop Canadian Hothouse Tomatoes have started in a small way, so get ready to promote beautiful fresh crop Cluster, Beef, and Specialty Tomatoes!

Round and **Roma Tomato** prices will begin to move higher as supplies out of Mexico and Florida have dropped. Both growing areas are through their flush, so supplies will be less, but quality out of both areas has been excellent.

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CV BLUEBERRIES

Blueberries remain promotable for early March. Volumes will be steady this week, but overall volumes will continue to decline out of Chile.

Florida growers are estimating that they will start harvesting new crop fruit in mid-March.



CV SQUASH

ALERT! Zucchini and Yellow Squash will be in extremely short supply this week. Most growing areas in Mexico were hit hard with the cold weather, resulting in limited harvests. Pricing jumped significantly this past week, and it looks to go higher.



CV GREEN BEANS

Green Beans are in excellent supply again this week out of Florida and the quality has been really nice.



CV GRAPES

Although there is a range of pricing on **Red** and **Green Seedless Grapes**, expect to pay high prices for good quality fruit.

Black Seedless Grapes are over-planted and over-produced, which is leading to a difficult market. Some fruit is also arriving with less than retail quality, making the category sloppy.



CV ONIONS

Pricing in the **Onion** market continues to be stable. Growers in Mexico are shipping large volumes of new crop **Onions**. There are plenty of supplies available throughout most storage regions.



CV LIMES

ALERT! The Lime market is in overdrive! Prices jumped thirty dollars within a week and will go even higher. Even with fruit now coming in from Columbia, supplies are still inadequate to meet demands. We could see this type of market running through April.



CV CUCUMBERS

ALERT! Cucumbers are extremely limited out of both Mexico and Florida this week. Pricing has jumped up significantly here, and many growers are saying that supplies will be so limited, that it could be multiple days until more volume crosses from Mexico.

Florida just started harvesting, but in a small way. Supplies will improve out of Florida by mid-March.



CV HASS AVOCADOS

Volumes of **Hass Avocados** are steady from Mexico and CA and are anticipated to remain at this level throughout the first half of March.

Despite similar promotable volumes anticipated for the coming weeks out of Mexico, a heavy percentage of grade 2 and small fruit remains prevalent.



CV POTATOES

The **Red Potato** market remains affordable as supplies currently exceed demand. We a re expecting a tremendous Florida crop with above average yields and great quality. Look for sharp deals on bagged Red Potatoes for St. Patrick's Day!

Russet Potato pricing and demand remains steady throughout the country. Idaho has shown some weakness in pricing. Supplies of Russet Potatoes appear to be stable in most growing areas.
