GOOD SUPPLIES OF ORGANIC POTATOES, SWEETS & ONIONS









GOOD NEWS! It's cooking, baking, soup and stew season. Now is the time for holiday meals. The good news is that Organic Potatoes, Sweet Potatoes, and Onions are in great shape.

Our Wisconsin grower-shipper is fully stocked on **Organic Russet Potatoes**, and quality is outstanding at the moment as this is the peak of the season.

Organic Red and **Gold Potatoes** from Manitoba, Canada will be in steady supply and price for the next two months and are also great items to promote. It's quality is strong 3lb bags and 50 lb bulk are available.

November is a great time to start opening up on **Organic Sweet Potatoes** and building larger-than-normal displays for the holidays. Pricing on all items will remain steady through the end of the year! Quality from AV Thomas "Natural Beauty" has been nice on all varietals.

California and Nevada grown premium **Organic Onions** are in peak season with excellent quality on all colors, plus **Organic Shallots**!



OG BROCCOLI & BEANS

GOOD NEWS! In early November, California continues to produce a significant quantity of Organic Broccoli. Virginia and North Carolina are major suppliers on the East Coast. Strong volumes and competitive prices from both coasts will make Thanksgiving promotions possible.

Organic Green Beans in bulk 25lb boxes will primarily come from Florida and Mexico, starting as early as the beginning of November. Lid pricing is set for the holiday, so consult with your sales rep to secure volume and movement. Expect decent supply and availability from both regions, with Mexico having a slower start but Florida helping meet our needs.

Organic French Beans in 10/11b bags will be available again this holiday with outstanding quality and no expected major concerns.



OG APPLES & PEARS

GOOD NEWS! It's peak season! We have excellent supplies and quality available for all our lines of Organic Apples. There's an opportunity to stock a wide selection to cater to all your customers' taste preferences.

Organic Opal Apples have arrived, boasting its bright yellow skin and slow-to-brown white flesh, which is also delicious.

Other premium snacking varieties available include; Organic Ambrosia, Envy, Lady Alice, Rockit, SugarBee, and SweeTango.

Organic Pears are in peak season. Data shows Pear shoppers spend more in your store! Care for those displays!

Organic Red Anjou Pears have just arrived, and Organic Comice Pears are expected to return in early November, just in time for the holiday season.



OG BERRIES

NOTE: Organic Strawberry pricing is on the rise as supplies decrease, which is typical for this time of year due to growing cycles. California's harvest is finished, and Mexico is only providing limited supply. However, we do have Ohio greenhouse grown Organic Strawberries available to bridge the gap, and the quality is impressive on those 10/12 oz packs.

ALERT! Organic Blackberry availability remains tight with high pricing due to recent hurricanes in Mexico, which have significantly damaged the crops. Growers are struggling to maintain consistent volume and quality. Expect shortages and limitations throughout the start of November.

NOTE: Organic Blueberry supplies from Peru and Chile are gradually improving, leading to slightly easing pricing (though still high) as more fruit becomes available. The overall quality has been consistently high.

Organic Raspberry prices are stabilizing as the flush season comes to an end. Harvests continue steadily with good availability and excellent quality.



OG BRUSSELS SPROUTS

Early November has seen a modest increase in the availability of **Organic Brussels Sprouts** from California, although prices remain high. Wisconsin production will resume in mid-November, which should increase availability and lower costs. Still we do not consider Organic Brussels Sprouts to be "promotable" for the holiday.

Packaged **Organic Brussels Sprouts** will be back in stock for mid-November, just in time for the holidays. Both pack styles will be available for the holiday season, but at high pricing.



OG CAULIFLOWER

In early November, **Organic Cauliflower** production and quality in California remains robust. Promotional opportunities are available until the middle of the month. **LOCAL Organic Color Cauliflower** and **Romanesco** is also available.

As November progresses, supply volume is expected to decrease, leading to price increases as Thanksgiving approaches. **Organic Cauliflower** availability will be sufficient for the holidays, but don't anticipate aggressive pricing or promotions.



OG FALL FRUITS

Organic Pomegranates from California are in stock. Larger sizing is more limited, but volumes should increase as the season progresses. Fill your shelves with high-quality fruit for November!

Organic Cranberries, Persimmons, and Fresh Figs continue in season!



OG PEAS

Organic Snap Peas are expected to be available around mid-November, marking the start of a program to ensure availability of **Organic Peas** year-round.

We're working on a bulk 10lb option as well as bag options for retail. Please coordinate with your sales rep for pricing and availability to ensure your needs are met.

Organic Snow Peas will become available year-round, but the first ones may not arrive until mid-December.



OG TOMATOES

NOTE: Greenhouse grown **Organic Beefsteak** and **Cluster Tomatoes** are arriving with nice quality but are somewhat limited in supply from Canada.

Specialty **Organic Snacking Tomatoes** from Wholesome and Savoura are available. Covilli's Mexico Fair Trade **Organic Heirloom Tomato** program is coming back into season for November.



OG LADY MOON VEG

GOOD NEWS! Early November sees a consistent supply of Organic Green Peppers and Organic Eggplant from Florida's Lady Moon Farms, offering excellent promotional opportunities due to a fantastic start to the Florida season.



OG ASPARAGUS

GOOD NEWS! Organic Asparagus from Alpine under the Hippie label has already arrived, and the quality is outstanding.

Promotable pricing may be available for Thanksgiving, so consider creating eye-catching displays and taking full advantage.

Reach out to your sales representative to prebook your holiday needs and lock in your pricing for volume to ensure we have you covered.



OG CELERY

GOOD NEWS! In November, California continues to produce a substantial amount of **Organic Celery**. Strong availability and excellent quality are expected to continue throughout the holiday season.

Thanksgiving-related promotions will boost sales of this beloved holiday product.



OG KIWI

ALERT! Organic Green Kiwi supplies are very limited. Expect higher pricing through the middle of November when Organic Kiwi from Italy will provide some relief to market pricing.

There will be some California **Organic Gold Kiwifruit** coming into season for mid-November.



OG ROOT VEG

OG SQUASH

Organic Yellow Squash, Zucchini, and Cucumbers are consistently supplied from Mexico and Florida, with competitive prices and excellent quality early in November.



OG AVOCADOS

Organic Hass Avocado supplies have rebounded after heavy rains and hurricane-related weather affected supplies in late October.

Equal Exchange Fair Trade **Organic Hass Avocados** will be in good supply for November promotion!



OG LETTUCE

Organic Iceberg and **Romaine Hearts** are steadily increasing in California, though there may be some restrictions as production moves south into the desert.

In New Jersey, **Organic Leaf** and **Romaine Lettuce** is still available, but production will slow down as the temperature drops. Production from California will become the primary source in mid-November, with North Carolina production serving as a supplement.

By the end of November, when Lady Moon Farms starts their winter season, procurement will mostly return to the East Coast in Florida. **Organic Iceberg Lettuce** is still sourced from New Jersey, but its availability will become limited as November progresses.



OG CITRUS

New crop **Organic Navel Oranges** from California are getting started with harvest beginning for many at the start of November. Expect high pricing to open and slight weekly declines as the season progresses. The first of the season fruit arrives to FSP on November 12th.

Organic Lemons from California are showing excellent quality however pricing is expensive to start out.

Organic Grapefruit will remain limited for the month of November as some growers/shippers pushed harvest back.



OG TROPICALS

Organic Dragon Fruit from California will be available at the beginning of November.

Organic Feijoa, Kiwano Melons, and Passion Fruit from California will be available in limited quantities for the month of November.

Organic Papaya volume from Mexico has stabilized after heavy rains in October. Overall, the fruit has been of excellent quality.

Organic Pineapple are improving somewhat in terms of availability.

ASPARAGUS & BRUSSELS SPROUTS FOR THANKSGIVING





GOOD NEWS! Asparagus is expected to have great quality and steady availability for the holiday season, with no significant oversupply. Product will be sourced from Peru and Mexico, with Mexico increasing availability due to recent rains from hurricanes.

Southern Peru is experiencing more fields closing due to warming weather as we move into mid-November. Growers anticipate a good supply, with pricing slightly higher this year and reduced demand due to concerns about past quality. Mexico will provide supply into December from Southern Baja and will cover most of our Thanksgiving needs.

Purple Asparagus will be available for Thanksgiving, with outstanding quality and steady availability. **White Asparagus** will also be available for Thanksgiving, maintaining outstanding quality and steady availability.

GOOD NEWS! In early November, the supply of **Brussels Sprouts** is still plentiful. As November progresses, expect a robust supply and competitive costs. This will be a fantastic product to promote around Thanksgiving.



CV BERRIES

NOTE: Strawberry prices are expected to increase as cooler weather patterns have slowed harvests in California. Mexico is also providing limited fruit, but not enough to meet demand. Expect reduced supplies and higher pricing heading into November.

ALERT! Blackberries continue to be extremely limited with weak quality out of Mexico due to major hurricanes impacting the growing regions over a two-week period, causing damage to harvests. Pricing remains high, and supplies won't rebound until closer to Thanksgiving.

NOTE: Blueberry pricing continues to gradually decrease as more fruit becomes available from Peru, Argentina, and Chile. Quality remains consistently good, and high pricing is expected to continue easing to maintain a steady flow of arrivals.

Raspberry pricing remains stable out of Mexico, with steady availability and excellent overall quality.



CV CITRUS

GOOD NEWS! New crop California Navel Oranges are now in season and supplies are now arriving to the East Coast for the first full week of November.

Seedless **Midnight Valencia Oranges** from South Africa and Chile on the East Coast are finishing up, and we will gradually transition to California **Navels** as the harvest begins to ramp up in November.

The supply of imported **Mandarins** from Chile and South Africa is tightening, while Morocco is experiencing delays. The start date for new crop California **Halo Clementine Mandarins** has been moved up to mid-November.

Florida is producing top-notch quality "Star Ruby" **Grapefruit**. Texas "Rio Star" **Grapefruits** are also in full supply across all sizes.

Mexican **Limes** are yielding well from the new crop, causing the pricing to drop faster than anticipated.



CV APPLES

Apples are generally promotable on both Eastern and Washington crops. Start opening up displays on varieties known for baking for the holidays.

Washington Extra Fancy Grade 100 sz Honeycrisp Apples are priced to promote! Make sure to take advantage of this opportunity to hit a price point for your shopper.

Eastern **Pink Lady Apples** should be available before the holiday season.

Popular **Envy Apples** are fully transitioned to new crop Washington fruit.

Washington Cosmic Crisp Apples will transition to the new crop in the last week of November, with expectations of an excellent-sized crop with better color and consistent flavor. Make sure to stock this Apple and prepare for promotions in December.



CV SQUASH

Green Squash will remain promotable with consistent supply from Georgia, Virginia, Florida, and Mexico. Prices may increase as Thanksgiving approaches, as fields in Mexico are being neglected due to low pricing.

Yellow Squash will gradually increase in price from now until Thanksgiving. Lower volume is expected from Mexico and more product being sourced from Georgia, Virginia, and Florida.



CV BEANS

Green Beans in bulk 25lb boxes will come primarily from Georgia for the next couple of weeks, and Florida has already started in Palmeto, providing supply through Thanksgiving. Although Florida has seen some rain, most fields in Palmeto have drained well. Lid pricing is set for the holiday, so contact your sales representative to secure pre-orders.

French Beans in 10/11b bags will be available again for the holiday, offering excellent quality and no anticipated supply concerns.



CV PINEAPPLES

GOOD NEWS! Pineapples remain in good supply at the start of November.

Premium high color and sugar **HoneyGlow** and **Golden Selection** premium fruit will also be available and in steady supply.



CV POMEGRANATES

POM Wonderful **Pomegranates** are in stock, and supplies are steady. Four Seasons will have POM Wonderful branded fruit in cartons and display shippers for the rest of the 2023 season. **POM POM Arils** will be available soon, offering 12/4oz and 8/8oz cup options.



CV PERSIMMONS

Fuyu and Hachiya Persimmons will be steady and in peak season for November from California. Hachiya Persimmons are just starting to ramp up in volume as that variety starts just a bit later than the Fuyu variety.

Fuyu Persimmons can be eaten when hard, while Hachiya Persimmons must be eaten when ripened to soft for optimal flavor.



CV GRAPES

Excellent quality **Grapes** from California are still available in XL and Jumbo sizes. Peru is currently offering more price value for large size **Grapes**. Both import and domestic **Grapes** have maintained good quality.



CV AVOCADOS

GOOD NEWS! Hass Avocados from Mexico are promotable at the start of November, especially 60ct fruit, which provides a great promotional opportunity during the month.

Four Seasons is now offering 32, 48, and 60ct sizes that are pre-conditioned to boost sales by allowing shoppers to have ready to cut fruit sooner.

14/5 ct bags of Hass Avocados are selling well too!



CV ONIONS

GOOD NEWS! Sweetie Sweet Onions are in full swing at the moment out of Nevada. Both bagged and bulk 40lb jumbo Sweetie Sweets will be in promotional supply with steady pricing through the end of November.



CV CAULIFLOWER

Cauliflower is abundantly produced in California in early November, offering increased volume and competitive pricing, allowing for strong promotional opportunities in the first few weeks of the month.

Production is expected to decrease significantly and prices will rise as Thanksgiving approaches. Thanksgiving will see **Cauliflower** available, but don't expect significant promotions, as prices will rise closer to the holiday.



CV SPECIALTY PEARS



Happi Pears will wind down for the season during November. Grab the last of these amazing **Pears** before they're gone.



CV CELERY

GOOD NEWS! Celery has remained easily obtainable in early November, thanks to great production and excellent quality. Price increases on this holiday favorite are expected as Thanksgiving approaches, but they won't be significant, as harvest numbers are projected to remain robust.



CV POTATOES

The **Idaho Count Russet Potatoes** continue to be in steady supply this week with steady pricing and very nice quality. The Idaho Count market is expected to remain this way through the holidays.

LOCAL Unclassified grade 10lb **White Potatoes** are back in stock for Winter holiday sales.

In addition to our Green Giant brand offerings, we have Dole label lines of 10/5 **Red, Gold**, and **Russet Potatoes**. Quality is very nice, and prices are locked in through the end of the year. These are all great items to promote.



CV LETTUCES

Iceberg, Romaine, and **Leaf Lettuce** are in plentiful supply as November begins.

The transition from the northern growing regions to the southern desert regions seems to be progressing smoothly, though there might be sudden changes in the coming weeks. Jersey LOCAL Lettuce is still available but will end soon as temperatures drop.

Romaine Hearts are the only **Lettuce** commodity experiencing price increases and reduced production.

NOTE: Kiwi is in short supply during a season transition gap. New crop Green Kiwi from Italy and Greece will reach the East Coast by mid-November, helping lower market costs. California fruit will also be available. Some Gold and Red Kiwi from Italy will be available later in the month

Black Mission Figs from California are winding down, but Mexico and Peru will provide steady options through the month.

The **Cantaloupe and Honeydew** market is experiencing an imbalance as Arizona, Mexico, and



CV LEMONS

California and Arizona **Lemons** are ramping back up in volume as the new growing district begins. Supplies will improve during November.

Coming back in to stock around November 10th are two special Lemons SKUs:

Sunkist Meyer Lemons in an 18/1 lb pouch bag Wonderful Seedless Lemons in a 12/2 lb bag



CV BROCCOLI CROWNS

Early November is expected to bring an abundance of **Broccoli** at competitive prices.

GOOD NEWS! The volume of **Broccoli Crowns** from the East Coast is increasing, leading to lower costs. California is still thriving and producing a significant amount in addition to what's grown on the East Coast. Strong yields of **Broccoli** from Mexico have also started.

OTHER STORIES

imports overlap. We anticipate a full transition to imports throughout the month of November.

Snap and Snow Peas will have steady availability and outstanding quality for Thanksgiving.

The first import **Cherries** from Chile are expected to arrive around the third week of November, just in time for the holiday table.

NOTE: Mango prices remain high from Brazil, with 12ct fruit being slightly cheaper than larger sizes for the middle of the month.

Long-term **Mango** supplies are expected to be extremely limited for the end of the year. Fruit from Ecuador will be in short supply and should start closer to the end of the month.

A small amount of **Ataulfos Mangoes** from Ecuador is in stock, but pricing is high.

Nut and Baking Displays should be built during early to mid-November. Nuts are not just for baking, they are good sellers as healthy, high energy snacks. Nuts and baking products will sell well through New Year's.

What to Include: In-shell & Shelled Mixed Nuts and Walnuts, Fresh Chestnuts and Roasted/Peeled Chestnuts, Pistachios, Almonds, Raisins, Dried Cranberries, Baking Dates, Medjool Dates, and Dried Figs. Some stores continue to have customers ask for Candied Fruit for making fruitcake.

Refill: Initial Diamond California Shelled, and In-shell nut orders have had prorates, shipping delays, and other pandemic related challenges. We'll be refilling throughout November and December from East Coast storage centers as available. Re-order early so you can stay ahead as product sells down.





Convenience and Recipe-Ready Products save time for busy meal preparers and sell well the week before Thanksgiving. Offer ready-to-use products that are washed and trimmed, peeled, and cut, or in a microwavable package.

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Greens Sell! Collards, followed by Kale, Mustard, Turnip Greens, are important for many ethnic and vegetarian holiday dinners.

TIP #1: Get pre-books in for Washed & Chopped Collards and Kale bags.

TIP #2: Get pre-books in for bunched Collards and Kale at stores where that is an in-demand traditional side dish.

TIP #3: Post a case price for Collards where appropriate.

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"Whoops, I forgot these sell so well for Thanksgiving!" Some items just move surprisingly well around Thanksgiving. Be ready on:

Clementines & Satsuma Mandarins, Navel Oranges, Pomegranates & Pomegranate Arils, Fresh Apple Ciders, Artichokes, Fennel (Anise), Cabbage & Cole Slaw Mixes, Parsnips, Rutabagas, Bananas (stay ahead on color), Grapes, Jarred fruits and Citrus salad, and Pineapples.

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Labor Scheduling and Order Planning can have a huge impact on your Thanksgiving Sales.

ORDERING TIP #1: Being a last minute orderer can burn you. PRE-BOOKS on key holiday items are strongly encouraged. You can always back off on your orders following the holiday, but you cannot sell what you don't have in your store. If you have a scheduled delivery for WED 11/22, that should be for last minute fill in and Friday sales.

ORDERING TIP #2: Bring in warm table and hard items in for THURS 11/16 - SAT 11/18 and fresh items in by SAT 11/18 - MON 11/20 BEFORE Thanksgiving so you and your staff are on the sales floor TUES 11/21 and WED 11/22, not in the back room waiting on and unloading trucks.

LABOR TIP #1: Your produce department should be set and ready to shop by 9:00 AM MON - WED for your customers' convenience. Do not get behind the '8' ball or you will disappoint your customers. Stay ahead and your holiday business will go smoothly. It's possible to expect a 5% sales bump vs current trends the week before Thanksgiving, and a 15-20% bump the week of Thanksgiving but packed into 6 days. Sales will then likely drop sharply for the week after Thanksgiving.

LABOR TIP #2: Schedule evening help on SUN - WED. Have your evening associates fill all hard goods like potatoes, onions, and roots, along with semi-perishable product lines such as juices, dressings, dips, nuts, dried fruits, etc. Most of the fruit counters can also be packed-out in the evenings – apples, pears, citrus, pineapples, bagged fruit, and melons. Stock your greens and wet vegetables, mushrooms, berries, and grapes in the morning before opening.



PRO TIP:

Plan your ordering with this "sales at retail" curve in mind."

To be in stock for the Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday rushes, you need to have product ordered and delivered 2-3 days ahead of these peak selling days.
