PROMOTABLE ORGANIC MANGOS





GOOD NEWS! Organic Mangos are promotable from Mexico from Crespo Organics to start May. Peak season will be June.

The round **Organic Mango** offerings for May will be on 8 ct, 10 ct, and 12 ct sizes of the "Tommy Atkins" variety, which is starting to show nice red blush on green skin.

For early May Organic Honey Ataulfo Mangos will be particularly promotable and abundant. 12/4 ct and 16-18ct sizing options will be in stock for ads and display builds.



OG MELONS

Organic Mini Seedless Watermelons from Northern Mexico will remain in good supply. 6 ct and 8 ct fruit is available with great quality and consistent pricing.

Organic Whole Seedless Watermelons from Mexico are just getting started with 60 ct bins. Supplies will be limited with high prices then will come down weekly with better volume.

9ct Organic Cantaloupes are now in season out of Mexico.



OG LETTUCES

GOOD NEWS! Organic Romaine Heart volumes have increased with great quality. Expect favorable conditions across the entire Lettuce category during May.

Organic Iceberg Lettuce from the West Coast is consistently available with great quality.

LOCAL New Jersey and Pennsylvania Organic Leaf and Romaine Lettuces are starting to show availability in early May. California grown product will supplement until LOCAL harvests are in full swing.



OG BERRIES

GOOD NEWS! Organic Strawberries remain available out of Baja, Mexico and CA. We will begin to transition to Santa Maria, CA crops solely with arrivals in May. Supplies should be good for Mother's Day.

Organic Blackberries remain available out of Mexico. Supply and pricing is steady and quality has been nice.

NOTE: Organic Blueberries are expected to start out of the Southeast USA next week. Volume will be light to start and expected to increase week over week. Quality should be nice on New Crop fruit. The last of Peruvian season has arrived and will be sold through during the first week of May.

NOTE: Organic Raspberries remain on the tighter side out of Mexico. Harvests are light and border issues are disrupting transfers. Quality has looked excellent.



OG PEAS

Organic Sugar Snap Peas in compostable packaging will be readily available starting in May at promotional prices.

Bulk **Organic Sugar Snap** and **Snow Peas** and **Purple** variations from California are in season throughout May.



OG PEPPERS

Organic Color Bell Peppers are in improved supply and 12/2 ct Red and 12/2 ct mixed **Organic Color Bell Pepper** packs are in steady availability.

Organic Green Peppers are primarily coming from Mexico, with Georgia starting by mid-May.

NOTE: Organic Mini Mix Sweet Peppers are limited, as Lady Moon Farms finished early and Mexico's production is focused on contracts, leaving little for spot buys and high pricing.



OG AVOCADOS

NOTE: Organic Hass Avocado 60 ct sizing supplies have dwindled.

Promote 48ct sizing for May since there is better availability. Prices out of Mexico remain elevated.



OG CITRUS

Organic Mandarin quality is strong, and supply should remain steady through May from California.

NOTE: Organic Navel Orange harvests remain limited across all sizes. Prices will continue to increase through the month of May.



OG BUNCHED GREENS

Organic Greens production, including Organic Kale varieties, Collards, and Dandelions, remains strong at Lady Moon Farms in Florida in early May.



OG PACKAGED GREEN BEANS

ALERT! Earthbound **Organic Packaged Green Bean** (222825) supplies remains tight with marginal quality due to growing region transitions out
West. Orders are being outed or cut and is expected to gap until Yuma harvests improve. Better fill rates are expected starting week of 5/11.

Fill in supply is being sourced from Pero Farms (244079) starting 5/3.



OG GRAPES

NOTE: Once the last of the Chilean Organic Red Grapes sell out in early May there will be a supply gap on Organic Grapes until the Mexico and Coachella, CA new crop harvests begin in the middle of May.



OG HARD SQUASH

Organic Hard Squash supply is improving with more volume crossing from northern Mexico.

Organic Kabocha Squash was tight but is expected to improve soon.

Organic Butternut Squash supply and sizing are better, with elevated prices beginning to ease over the month of May.



OG POTATOES

Organic Red and Gold Potatoes from Cal-O will start for earl;y to mid-May, with outstanding quality expected. New crop Organic Color Potatoes overall have shown excellent quality.

ALERT! Organic Count Russet Potatoes remain very tight.

NOTE: Organic Japanese Sweet Potato prices will rise with May arrivals. Supply remains extremely tight. This market is expected to strengthen further as the storage crop season progresses.



OG BROCCOLI & CAULIFLOWER

Organic Broccoli and **Cauliflower** from California remains in good supply.

GOOD NEWS! Organic Broccoli production on the East Coast began in Georgia in late April while North Carolina's production began early May offering additional supply from California at comparable prices.



OG CELERY

NOTE: Organic Celery from California and Mexico has limited volume with very good quality. With limited volumes, a decline in quality is possible. This trend will continue for most of May.



OG MUSHROOMS

ALERT! Mushroom King's Organic Exotic Mushrooms including Organic Shiitake Mushrooms will have a price increase in early May as tariffs hike inputs from China (despite U.S. cultivation). They're working on alternative sourcing to offset costs and will provide updates.



OG STONE FRUIT

The first **Organic Apricots** and **White Peaches** are scheduled to arrive around May 8th. A strong crop is expected to follow as volume ramps up.

The first **Organic Cherries** of the season are expected to arrive around the second week of May. Supplies will be light and expensive.



OG WARM VEG

Organic Zucchini, Cucumbers, Eggplant, and Yellow Squash are currently sourced from Florida and Mexico, with Georgia expected to start around mid-May.

GOOD NEWS! Lady Moon Farms in Florida is flushing on Organic Zucchini and has good Organic Eggplant volume, while Organic Yellow Squash and Cucumbers remain limited.

Mexico is winding down but still promotable on **Organic Cucumbers** and **Yellow Squash**.



OG TOMATOES

Organic Beefsteak Tomatoes remain available out of Canada. Pricing remains steady, supply remains steady and quality has been excellent.

Organic Tomatoes on the Vine remain available out of Canada. Pricing will decrease slightly as more volume starts out of Canada.

Organic Grape Tomatoes remain available from Lady Moon farms Florida season and other growers. Quality has been excellent. Lady Moon's Florida season will end in mid-May on their Organic Snacking Tomatoes and return in Summer from their LOCAL PA farm.

NOTE: Volumes of **Organic Brussels Sprouts** remain available and of great quality with rising prices.

NOTE: Organic Brussels Sprouts High-graphic bag options remain available with supplies decreasing in early May.

OTHER STORIES

NOTE: Organic Apple pricing is rising across all varieties as supplies dwindle. A firm to tight import crop is not expected until June. **Organic Honeycrisp Apples** are likely to finish in about four to six weeks.

NOTE: Washington **Organic Opal** and **SugarBee Apple** varieties are finished for the season.

Organic Pink Lady Apples will have enough supply to last until the next crop, but prices are increasing as other varieties finish and demand rises.

GOOD NEWS! California Organic Artichokes are in their peak promotional period. The quality and availability have been exceptional with favorable pricing.



CONVENTIONAL MARKET NEWS

MAY 2 - MAY 8, 2025

LOCAL ASPARAGUS SEASON





LOCAL Asparagus is in season and available out of New Jersey and Delaware.

Quality is excellent and volumes are generally steady, though some early-week supply challenges are possible with expected rain and cooler temperatures. Pricing has come down to keep supplies moving on the 28 lb cases.

May is the best time of the year to promote **LOCAL Asparagus**!



CV BERRIES

Blackberries continue out of Mexico. Pricing is steady overall, and quality has been excellent.

NOTE: Blueberries remain a challenge coming out of the Southeast. Growers are hopeful harvests will increase in early May, but they are still reporting lower-than-expected yields. Pricing should begin to decrease, but supply could remain a challenge.

NOTE: Raspberries will remain tight overall out of Mexico. Yields remain low and transfers from Mexico continue to be a challenge at the border. Quality has been excellent.

Strawberries are expected to tighten up for Mother's Day.

California experienced some rain followed by cooler temperatures, which lowered harvests tremendously, causing pro-rates and order cancellations on **Strawberries**. Quality has been outstanding, with big, flavorful berries. Better weather and yields are expected for Mid-May.



CV MELONS

GOOD NEWS! Florida 45 ct and 60 ct Seedless Watermelons remain consistent with steady pricing and availability in early May.

Bin 35 ct **Seeded Watermelon** production is opening in Florida. Supplies are not flush but should improve weekly.

GOOD NEWS! Mexican Mini Seedless Watermelons are steady with promotable pricing and great quality.

Cantaloupe and Honeydew supply is tightening and pricing is being driven by off-program deals. The month of May could be challenging for promotions until the southwest desert region begins.



CV STONE FRUIT

The first new crop California **Apricots** are set to arrive around 5/6. Pictures of the fruit look great, and it is expected to be off and running with a large crop of good-sized fruit. We expect to have some California **Red Apricots** by mid-May.

The first California Cherries are loaded and expected to arrive around 5/7. Supplies will be very limited to start and expensive. Expect prices to decline week by week and become promotable after Memorial Day and into June, when Washington is expected to start with a big crop of high-quality fruit.

First of the season California Yellow & White Peaches are in-house in both bags and bulk euro boxes. Supplies are increasing, and prices will ease week by week.

A bumper crop out of South Carolina **Peaches** is expected to join around the third week of May.



CV LETTUCES

GOOD NEWS! The California Lettuce category continues to improve in early May. Iceberg Lettuce shows stronger weights and quality with favorable pricing.

California **Leaf Lettuce** and **Romaine** maintain good volume and quality with favorable pricing.

LOCAL New Jersey Leaf Lettuce and Romaine started in late April with minimal volume. Production and volume will increase throughout May.



CV PINEAPPLES

Pineapples from the East Coast are in better supply, but expect higher pricing for the first week of May as tariff pricing is in effect and volumes are starting to correct themselves.



CV MANGOS

GOOD NEWS! Mangos from Mexico are starting to have good volume. Pricing will start to decrease during May. Guatemalan Mangos are now available in the marketplace with lower costs.

Ciruli Brothers' large premium 14 ct **Champagne Ataulfo Mangos** are in good supply with excellent quality.



CV PEPPERS

GOOD NEWS! 11lb Hothouse Red, Orange, and Yellow Bell Peppers continue to be promotable overall. Quality has been exceptional across all colors.

Green Bell Pepper prices have inched up slightly as Florida and Mexico wind down and we await larger volumes out of Georgia, expected during the start of May.



CV GRAPES

Late crop import **Green Grapes** have continued to rise in price, while **Red Grapes** remained steady compared to the previous week. Supply of **Red Grapes** is expected to improve throughout May.

New crop Mexico **Grapes** have started harvests in Jalisco at high pricing. The full Mexico and Coachella, CA **Grape** deal will ramp up closer to June. Import **Cotton Candy Grapes** continue to have good availability for early May.



CV WARM VEG

GOOD NEWS! Zucchini, Cucumbers, Eggplant, and Yellow Squash are in good supply with steady pricing across three regions. Mexico is winding down and focused on contracts, while Florida is finishing up as Georgia ramps up.

Georgia is currently abundant and affordable with **Zucchini** and **Yellow Squash**, with **Eggplant** and **Cucumbers** expected in early May.



CV GREENHOUSE CUCUMBERS

GOOD NEWS! Seedless and Mini Seedless Cucumbers remain promotable out of Canada. Supplies remain strong and quality has been excellent, with promotable pricing.



CV GREEN BEANS

NOTE: Florida **Green Beans** continues to have higher pricing and tight supplies. Despite the elevated prices, quality remains strong, and no prorates are expected to finish out the month.



CV SWEET CORN

GOOD NEWS! Sweet Corn continues to be available out of Florida. Quality has been excellent. Pricing will increase slightly due to elevated freight rates out of Florida.



CV AVOCADOS

Mexican **Hass Avocado** volumes are great for the Cinco De Mayo holiday celebrations just at higher pricing than past years.

Ask about Four Seasons' free display bin with purchase of Avocados from Mexico!



CV SUNGOLD KIWI

SunGold Kiwi from Zespri's New Zealand crop has arrived! Volume-fill and clamshell options are available.

NOTE: Green Kiwi supply will be tight during May.



CV ARTICHOKES

California **Artichokes** prices remain elevated but with exceptional quality. The transition to the northern growing regions in mid-May will cause availability to increase and prices to stabilize.



CV TOMATOES

GOOD NEWS! Beefsteak and Cluster Tomatoes are promotable out of Canada. Production remains strong and quality has been outstanding.

GOOD NEWS! Grape, Cherry, Medley, and Campari Tomatoes will all have promotable pricing, excellent quality, and strong supplies.

Roma Tomato pricing increased slightly with some added demand for the Cinco de Mayo holiday. Supplies remain steady overall out of Mexico and Florida. Quality has been excellent.

GOOD NEWS! Vine Ripe Jumbo Tomatoes remain available out of Florida. Quality and color have been excellent, with great jumbo size just in time for grilling season!



CV BROCCOLI & CAULIFLOWER

GOOD NEWS! Georgia Broccoli Crowns continues to offer excellent volume and competitive pricing on East Coast product, which is expected to carry strong momentum through May.

GOOD NEWS! California Cauliflower has favorable cost, quality, and availability through the first week of May. Georgia-grown Cauliflower offers a competitively priced supplement.



CV LOCAL VEG

LOCAL New Jersey Chard, Collard, Dandelion, and Kale, are expected to be available through spring and summer with great quality, good supply, and competitive pricing.

LOCAL New Jersey **Leeks** and **Scallions** have favorable pricing and quality as production increases during the spring.

Packaged **Scallions** are also now available from a **LOCAL** New Jersey grower, perfect for spring-focused and local displays.

LOCAL New Jersey **Cilantro, Parsley, Dill,** and **Mint** shows great quality at competitive prices.

NOTE: California **Brussels Sprouts** supply remains limited with elevated prices. Quality remains reliable.

California Mandarin supply remains strong.

Morocco **Mandarins** are finishing up, which may create a gap in import product until Peru and Chile begin to ramp up.

OTHER STORIES

NOTE: Limited production, increased costs, and minimal rain are expected to push pricing higher on **Limes.** Sizing will peak smaller throughout the month of May.

Whole imported **Pomegranates** out of Chile and Peru have improved in consistency and are in good supply for the start of May.

New import **Comice Pears** are expected this weekend. Beautiful pictures of these have set our expectations high.

New import Forelle Pears have arrived, and they are beautiful.

- Have evening associates stock these sections to avoid congestion in aisles during business hours.
- Bring in hard vegetables and fruit by Thursday, May 22. Key items include:

Fruits:

Apples, Pears, Oranges, Lemons & Limes, Honeydew, Cantaloupe, Pineapples, Bin Watermelons (No need to be overly cautious with bin Watermelons – this is just the start of summer picnic season, and any extras carry low risk. Store at room temperature)

• Stock Sweet Corn by the pallet (42 cases per pallet) – aim to have it in by Thursday, May 22, and Friday, May 23. Keep it watered or iced down.
