

LADY MOON FLORIDA ORGANIC LETTUCES







GOOD NEWS! High quality East Coast **Organic Leaf** and Romaine Lettuces are now in peak season from Floridal

GOOD NEWS! Organic Green Leaf, Organic Red Leaf, and Organic Romaine, are flush with excellent quality from Lady Moon Farms in Florida. Color and texture are strong, offering a dependable lane while Western regions reset to winter production.

Some limited volume of Florida Organic Romaine Hearts are also in season from Lady Moon Farms.

GOOD NEWS! Organic Butter Lettuce and Organic Boston Lettuce are in good supply from Lady Moon Farms in Florida, with stable packs and strong loadability. These are promotable where sets allow.



OG BERRIES

GOOD NEWS! Organic Blackberries from Central Mexico are showing strong promotability on shipper brands. With excellent quality, affordable pricing, and ample supply, they present an ideal opportunity for impactful promotions.

Organic Raspberry supplies from Central Mexico on shipper brands remain normal to strong, with good availability and improving quality on each arrival. Pricing is expected to hold steady. ALERT! Driscoll's volumes, however, remain extremely limited and will continue to be very short.

NOTE: Organic Blueberry supplies will begin to decrease weekly through December. Peruvian volume continues to decline, and Mexico is contributing very little. Chilean imports are not expected to begin until mid- to late January.

ALERT! Organic Strawberry availability will be very tight. Central Mexico production is light, Florida volume is minimal, and acreage is down in both growing regions. Supplies should remain constrained for 2-3 more weeks until Baja comes online. Expect pro-rates and limits with some out of stocks in between arrivals.



OG CALIFORNIA CITRUS

GOOD NEWS! Organic Mandarins continue to deliver excellent flavor and strong quality out of California. "Halos" and "Cuties" Organic Mandarins are in-house and performing well with the Clementine variety for December.

Organic Navel Oranges will see improving markets as stronger supply and drier harvest conditions build in California. Expect pricing to ease in the coming weeks.

Organic Lemon and Meyer Lemon harvests are improving and Organic Grapefruit is in steadier supply too.

Organic Cara Cara Oranges will begin harvest in mid-December, with fruit expected in time for Christmas.



OG AVOCADOS

GOOD NEWS! Organic Hass Avocados will be promotable for December. Be sure to take advantage of the Four Seasons and Calavo Avocados from Mexico Display Promotion and Contest running throughout the month. All sizes and bags are in good supply.

"Equal Exchange" Organic Fair Trade Hass Avocados will be available in 48ct and 60ct fruit. 8/4ct Ready-Cycle Trays will also be available. Plan to promote these items heavily.







LADY MOON OG VEG

GOOD NEWS! Organic Green and Red Cabbage are in great supply and strong quality from Lady Moon Farms in Florida.

GOOD NEWS! Organic Kales, Organic Collards, and Organic Baby Bok Choy from Lady Moon are also in excellent supply and condition.

Florida Organic Fennel, Green Bell Peppers, Jalapeno Peppers, Mini Sweet Peppers, Shishito Peppers, and Zucchini are all in season with beautiful quality from Lady Moon Farms for December.



OG COLOR BELL PEPPERS

NOTE: Organic Colored Bell Peppers from Canada, Mexico, and Israel remain lighter in availability, especially on Red Bell Peppers. Strong Organic demand and smaller plantings are keeping this category at elevated pricing levels through early December, with additional increases anticipated later in the month.



OG ASPARAGUS

GOOD NEWS! Organic Asparagus is benefitting from light post-holiday lower demand and clean fields. Supplies are promotable with dependable coverage and attractive costs compared to recent periods.



OG FALL FRUIT

Organic Hachiya Persimmons are nearing the end of their California season and are expected to finish in early December. Organic Fuyu Persimmons will last slightly longer but should wind down before Christmas.

NOTE: Organic Pomegranates from California are expected to finish around mid-December.
Organic Pomegranate Arils remain in steady supply in 4oz packs under the "I Love Pomegranate" label.

Organic Brown Turkey Figs from California are still available.

Organic Cranberry supplies will be available through mid-December then finish for the season.



OG CUCUMBERS

GOOD NEWS! Field-grown Organic Cucumbers from Mexico are in good supply and have reasonable pricing.

Organic Mini Cucumbers and Organic Euro Cucumbers continue to show steady production and excellent quality from greenhouse programs in Mexico and Canada. Supplies are adequate and pricing remains in the average range.



OG CAULIFLOWER & ROMANESCO

Organic Cauliflower and Organic Romanesco are improving, with better counts, more consistent quality, and easing costs as desert plantings expand.



OG APPLES & PEARS

Washington Organic Apples remain in excellent supply with top varieties such as Ambrosia, Cosmic Crisp, Envy, Evercrisp, Fuji, Gala, Granny Smith, Honeycrisp, Kanzi, Lady Alice, McIntosh, Opal, Pazazz, Pink Lady, Rockit, SugarBee and SweeTango.

Washington **Organic Pears** also remain steady in supply with popular varieties including Anjou, Asian, Bartlett, Bosc, Comice, Concorde, and Red Pears.



OG CELERY

ALERT! Organic Celery, including field and hearts, is extremely limited and **not** promotable.

A very high market is expected to persist until early January when desert supplies begin to help. Blight and discoloration are issues evident in the product.



OG MANGOES

Organic Mangoes from Ecuador remain somewhat limited. **Organic Mangoes** from Peru will begin arriving shortly.

Organic Dried Ataulfo and Organic Red Mangoes from Crespo Organics are now in stock in 4oz and 1lb bags—perfect for winter snacking.







OG ROOT VEG

We are now offering a new 12/2lb pack of **Organic Soup Mix Vegetables** from Harmony Valley in Wisconsin under code 247006. This will replace the previous 8/3lb pack and offer a more attractive retail price.

This is being offered along with 12/2lb **Organic Roasting Veg Mix.**



OG TOMATOES

Field-grown **Organic Snacking Tomatoes** from Lady Moon Farms in Florida have strong supply and excellent color. Demand is solid, and pricing is favorable.

Specialty Organic Cherry on-vine and Cocktail on-vine Tomatoes from "Savoura" greenhouse in Quebec continue to show strong availability and quality, offering excellent eating varieties that help drive category growth.

Greenhouse Organic Beefsteak Tomatoes and Organic Tomatoes On-the-Vine continues to show dependable quality and steady availability. Volumes are sufficient, with higher markets.

Organic Roma Tomatoes from Mexico and Canada continue to offer consistent sizing and quality, though overall availability remains limited. Movement is steady and pricing is holding at an average level.

Organic Mammoth Kiwifruit in clamshells from California will be available through December.

Organic Feijoa, Organic Passion Fruit, and Organic Kiwano Horned Melons from California will be in stock to start December.

NOTE: Organic Carrots in cellos and value-added packs remain limited on popular sizes.
Bunny-Luv/Cal-O and Bolthouse brands will be sourced to keep up fill-rates.

Organic Bi Color Corn will be wrapping up in Florida by mid-December as the season winds down.



OG GRAPES

Organic "Sweet Globe" Green Grapes from Peru are available at a premium.

NOTE: Organic Red Grapes are expected to begin arriving from South America in mid to late December.



OG BROCCOLI

Organic Broccoli and **Organic Broccoli Crowns** are tapering in the East while desert supplies scale up. Quality continues improving and the market is easing as volume increases.

Organic Sweet Baby Broccoli is in good supply with flush availability, while Organic Broccoli Rabe is showing better texture and stronger color each week. Continuity is expected to stabilize by mid-month.







OG PINEAPPLES

ALERT! Organic Pineapples remain extremely tight from Costa Rica.

Four Seasons has begun carrying **Organic** Mexican **Pineapples** to offset the Costa Rica shortage. Expect continued limited supply overall.



OG SPECIALTY VEG

Lady Moon **Organic Bok Choy** and **Baby Bok Choy** is in season from Florida.

Organic Endive and **Organic Escarole** from Flaim Farms in New Jersey continue in good volume and quality. Availability should remain smooth into the final weeks of their season as we transition to winter programs.

NOTE: Organic Artichokes remain limited due to reduced acreage and selective sizing. Treat this item as an opportunistic buy rather than a dependable program driver for now.

OTHER STORIES

NOTE: Organic Brussels Sprouts in 10 lb packs remain tight, though quality and sizing on arrival have improved. Pricing remains elevated in the short term, then should ease as new blocks open and demand moderates.

Organic Green Skin Avocados from Florida will be available starting early December. ALERT! Organic Mini Seedless Watermelons remain limited in availability out of Mexico due to border-crossing challenges and tight supplies. Availability is expected to improve by mid-December as new fields begin harvesting. Organic Hard Squash will begin transitioning to new crop Mexico with Organic Delicata this week. Organic Spaghetti will follow with the new crop arriving late next week.

LOCAL Organic Acorn, Organic Butternut, Organic Honeynut and Organic Kabocha continue to be sourced from PA and NJ with excellent quality.

ALERT! Organic Iceberg Lettuce remains very limited through the transition gap. Improved arrivals are anticipated by mid-December with stronger availability into late month.



CONVENTIONAL MARKET NEWS

DECEMBER 5 - DECEMBER 12, 2025

BROCCOLI AND CAULIFLOWER IMPROVING





GOOD NEWS! Broccoli and Broccoli Crowns from the Southeast and West, are seeing lower pricing as Mexican production expands and adds volume. Quality remains excellent.

Broccoli Rabe remains on the lighter side, although texture and color continue to improve as desert plantings advance.

Sweet Baby Broccoli continues to show cleaner overall appearance, though smaller florets persist. Supplies are increasing gradually, and pricing is easing.

GOOD NEWS! Cauliflower in 12 ct packs continues to improve with more consistent quality, reduced bead issues, and easing costs as desert acreage expands.

NOTE: Colored Cauliflower remains selective, though availability is improving week by week.



CV CITRUS

GOOD NEWS! Florida Tangerines, specifically **Autumn Honeys** from Noble Citrus, are delivering excellent flavor and strong overall quality.

GOOD NEWS! Mandarins show strong supply and excellent quality from early-season California Cementine varieties, while Chile continues to offer exceptional value compared to California markets. Morocco is expected to begin shipping in mid-December.

Navel Oranges have strong volume on large fruit out of California, and markets continue to ease. Promotional opportunities remain favorable through December. Ask about Jumbo Navel pre-book in display bins. "Vintage Sweets" Heirloom Navel Oranges are back in season with the first arrivals in stock 12/11.

Cara Cara Oranges (pink flesh) harvest has begun, and supplies are expected to strengthen by mid-December.

OUTLOOK: Sumo Citrus Dekopons will start in December with the first 25ct and 9/3lb bag arrivals expected 12/16.



CV LETTUCE & SALADS

NOTE: Iceberg Lettuce is improving in weight and volume as more desert fields open. Pricing are high but will ease heading into mid-December.

Leaf Lettuces, including **Green Leaf**, **Red Leaf**, and **Romaine**, have improved significantly following the transition. Light promotions are possible as acreage continues to scale later in December.

Romaine Hearts are gaining stability, while costs ease as production expands across desert regions.

Boston Lettuce and **Artisan Lettuce** continue to stabilize as desert acreage expands.

As Lettuce quality and yields improve, **Packaged Salad** fill-rates and shelf life are getting better too.



CV BERRIES

GOOD NEWS! Blackberries have abundant supply, sharp pricing, and excellent quality.

NOTE: Blueberries will tighten as fewer Peruvian arrivals come in, with pricing expected to rise. Quality remains excellent.

Raspberries from Central Mexico are steady with lighter harvest volumes, consistent pricing, and strong quality.

ALERT! Strawberries have lighter harvests from Florida and Central Mexico for early December.

OUTLOOK: Strawberry volume is expected to improve mid December. Pricing is expensive for now, with better conditions anticipated as supplies strengthen.





CV KIWIFRUIT

California **Red Kiwi** in a 16/1 lb clamshell will be available through December.

Green Kiwi has transitioned from Zespri New Zealand fruit to winter crop arrivals from Italy and Greece.



CV TOMATOES

Hothouse Beefsteak Tomatoes and Tomatoes
On-the-Vine are transitioning away from Canadian production as Mexican programs take on more demand. Quality remains strong with supplies meeting current needs, keeping pricing stable.

Roma and Round Tomatoes from East Coast fields and Mexico are tighter as they rebound from holiday demand and limited harvests. Quality remains solid, with elevated markets. Some relief is expected as new Florida and Mexican production builds lain late December.



CV WATERMELONS

Mini Seedless Watermelons are arriving from Guatemala, showing excellent quality and promotable pricing. Florida also has availability in large sizing.

Seedless Watermelons from Florida and Mexico have stable pricing and consistent quality. The outlook for December remains steady with similar conditions expected throughout the month.



CV MANGOES

Mango supplies from Ecuador are slowing. Container delays and the slow start to Peru's season are tightening availability on key sizes along the East Coast.



CV CHERRIES

Cherries imported from Chile are shifting from air-shipped to vessel arrivals in mid-December. Supplies are expected to improve and pricing ease down by 10–20 percent closer to Christmas.



CV AVOCADOS

GOOD NEWS! Avocados are featured in a month-long December promotion in partner-ship with Avocados From Mexico and Calavo, highlighting all sizes with strong availability on premium 36ct fruit.

December will be a great time to promote on price and quality! Bulk and Bags!



CV GRAPES

ALERT! Grapes face a challenging December due to vessel delays on new crop imports, limited harvest, and the early end to the California season. Pricing is expected to stay elevated until Chile enters the market near Christmas. Quality is just okay.



CV SNACKING TOMATOES

Snacking Tomatoes, including Cherry, Grape, and Medley varieties, remain in shorter supply overall, though availability is holding steady. Some market opportunities are emerging as December progresses, especially on greenhouse specialty packs of Snacking Tomatoes.



CV PEAS & BEANS

NOTE: Snow Peas and Sugar Snap Peas from Guatemala and Peru remain tight as Peru winds down. Quality varies and pricing remains firm.

English Peas from Guatemala continue to show choppy arrivals, keeping markets firm until field and flight schedules align more consistently.

French Beans from Guatemala remain sensitive due to weather and shipping challenges, resulting in uneven arrivals and shorter shelf life.

GOOD NEWS! Field-grown **Green Beans** have stabilized with good quality from southern regions and adequate supply.





CV CUCUMBERS

GOOD NEWS! Mini and Euro Cucumbers from Mexico and Canadian greenhouse programs show strong quality and consistent arrivals. Balanced demand and solid production continue to support favorable promotional conditions.



CV PINEAPPLES

GOOD NEWS! Pineapples have improved following Thanksgiving, and early December offers promotable opportunities, especially on 7ct fruit.



CV ARTICHOKES

GOOD NEWS! Artichokes are flush with promotable volume, clean packs, and consistent sizing, offering strong opportunities for ads while current production holds.



CV PEPPERS

Green Peppers are seeing firming in the market with slight price increases. Supplies remain adequate and quality strong from southern growing areas.

Jalapeno Peppers and **Habanero Peppers** are higher in price due to reduced Florida harvests.

Colored Bell Peppers continue to command premium pricing. Mexican production is beginning to cover more of the demand as Canadian acreage winds down. Supply remains adequate but not abundant, keeping markets in the average to slightly elevated range.



CV APPLES & PEARS

Apples from eastern and western regions offer an abundant premium supply in both bulk and bags. A full assortment is available, including Cortland, Cosmic Crisp, Empire, Envy, Evercrisp, Fuji, Gala, Gold Delicious, Granny Smith, Honeycrisp, Hunnyz, Lady, Lemonade, Ludacrisp, Lucyrose, Lucyglo, Macoun, Mcintosh, Pink Lady, Red Delicious, Rockit, Rome, Ruby Frost, Snap Dragon, Stayman, Sugarbee, and Sweetango.

Pears from the Pacific Northwest remain in excellent supply and quality across Anjou, Asian, Bartlett, Bosc, Comice, Forelle, Red, and Seckel varieties.



CV FALL FRUIT

POM Arils will remain steady through December, including the new Twin Pack of two 8 oz cups offered in a 6-pack (code 247045).

Pomegranates from California are winding down quickly. POM Wonderful will conclude bin shipments by mid-December, and cartons may not hold through Christmas.

Hachiya Persimmons remain limited and will finish mid-December. **Fuyu Persimmons** will continue into late December with steadier availability.

Persimmon education remains essential. Fuyu Persimmons should be eaten firm like an Apple, while Hachiya Persimmons must be consumed very soft, similar to a soft Mango or jelly.

Black Mission Figs from Mexico are in stock, offered in a 12/8 oz clamshell.

Fresh **Cranberries** are in good supply for mid-December.

OTHER STORIES

ALERT! Brussels Sprouts in 25 lb packs show improving availability with cleaner arrivals, though markets remain high until demand softens and new harvests provide consistent grade. Use caution when planning promotions and expect a gradual easing late December.

Endive and Escarole from New Jersey and California continue with good supply from Flaim Farms as they near the end of their season. California production remains workable with improving daily flow.

California **Fennel** continues to show strong flavor, although bulbs remain on the smaller side. Volume is climbing and the market is expected to ease heading into mid-December.

NOTE: Radicchio remains limited with improvement expected as additional desert harvests begin to arrive later in the month.

NOTE: Carrots in cellos and value-added packs remain tight.

NOTE: Scallion volumes are tight, with higher pricing driven by limited supplies out of Mexico.

Chestnuts from Italy, premium roasted and packed by Bella Vita, are available in bulk 25 lb options and 20/1 lb jute bags.

Bulk and tray pack **Bi Color Corn** is steady out of Southern Florida with dependable supply and consistent quality.

ALERT! Celery is extremely limited. Availability is not promotable, and markets remain very high until early January when desert volume is expected to improve supply.







- Have key Christmas displays set by Dec 16 to maximize sales and labor efficiency.
- Bring in tonnage/items on Dec 16-20 deliveries.
- Stay ahead on potatoes, onions, dips—low shrink, but don't miss sales by running out.
- Keep bananas with good yellow color for fruit salads.
- From Wed. before Christmas, expect busy days—capture every sale.
- Use off-hour fills for hard goods (nuts, dried fruit, potatoes, onions) and longer shelf-life items (dressings, dips, salsa, hummus, juices, snacks).
- Daytime labor should focus on fresh displays and customer engagement.
- Expect large orders 12/21 and 12/23—plan ahead to avoid delays.


